**Subject:** East Garage Parking Rate at Main Courthouse

#### Commissioners,

Currently, parking at the East Garage at the Main Courthouse is extremely limited. On February 28, 2006 (agenda item #5), the Board approved increasing the parking rate of the East Garage from \$2.00 to \$8.00 per hour to conserve parking for employees, jurors, witnesses, BSO detention employees and County employees.

As you are aware, the County is opening a 1,000 car garage (South Garage) for employees in 2014 to support the new courthouse tower that will be opening in 2015. Once this South Garage is fully operational, our plan has been to review the usage, capacity and parking rates at the East Parking Garage. We have discussed our plan with many of you as well as the Courthouse Taskforce Advisory Committee.

operated parking facilities maintained by the Facilities Maintenance Division. This item includes a number of minor changes to the Administrative Code that establish fees for County parking garages and parking lots. These minor changes include:

- Eliminating outdated language that refers to an automated parking system that was removed from the Judicial Garage and cashiers that were removed from the Judicial Garage.
- Adding a flat fee of \$5.00 per night on Thursday nights. Currently this rate applies only to Wednesday nights.
- Starting metered parking at 5:00 am at the same hourly rates.
- Adding provisions for free parking for the disabled.
- Minor wording clarifications.

This item also includes a significant change in the hourly rate charged in the Judicial Center East Garage.

Parking is extremely limited in the Broward County Judicial Center East Garage, and the Facilities Maintenance Division seeks to assure adequate parking is available for Courthouse employees, jurors, witnesses, BSO detention employees, and County employees. In an effort to conserve parking for employees, staff recommends an increase in the rate from \$2.00 to \$8.00 per hour. This rate is consistent with the only other covered parking adjacent to the courthouse (110 Tower) and will encourage parking spaces to turn over quickly. The average rate for the parking lots in the area is \$4.00 per hour.

On February 14, 2006, the Board directed staff to develop a Chronology of events regarding the agreement with New River Village and subsequent amendments to the agreement. This information is provided in detail in Exhibits 2 and 3. Staff was also directed to review the Agreement to determine if the County could buy back the 243 parking spaces currently leased to New River Village.

The agreement with New River Village allows for the County to take back the spaces only with the consent of both parties. On February 21, 2006 County staff spoke with Mr. Granvil Tracy and reported that Mr. Tracy indicated he is not willing to release any spaces back to the County, gratis or otherwise, as they are needed for Phase III, which he expects to commence in approximately eighteen months.

The 243 spaces being leased by New River Village have always been, and are currently available for County use when not being used by New River Village. Approximately 80 of the spaces were used by New River Village's contractor during the construction of Phase II, but the remaining 163 spaces were available to the County. Phase II construction is almost complete which will free up those spaces until Phase III begins in approximately 18 months.

- b. The Office of the County Administrator or his-her designee will review and approve or disapprove the activation of Special Event Pay Parking for events occurring on or near Broward County parking facilities or lots and, for which the public will utilize a Broward County parking facility.
- c. Other parking provided to Broward County-employees and support agencies is addressed in Administrative Order #851, Facilities and Real Property

  Management Procedures.

#### Section 4. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution.

#### Section 5. INCLUSION IN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Resolution shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Administrative Code; and that the sections of this Resolution may be renumbered or relettered and the

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#### Staff Report on Leased Parking Spaces

In response to the Board's inquiry regarding parking spaces in the East Garage and the ability for the County to take them back:

The agreement with New River Village (subsidiary of the American Land Housing Group, Inc., 115 N.W. 167 Street, Suite 300, North Miami Beach, FL 33169, (305) 654-1500), consists of three phases:

#### Phase I (240) units

Phase I was built as rental units. It has been completed for several years and is currently being converted to condominiums. Part of the facility is on land owned by New River Village, and part of it is built on County-owned land through a land lease. It was recently sold to Montecito Property Company, 7785 Baymeadows Way, Suite 200, Jacksonville, FL 32256-7561, (904) 339-0091.

#### Phase II (409) units

When construction began on Phase II, it was intended to be rental housing, but was converted to condominiums during construction. Phase II is built on County-owned property and is either complete or very near complete. It was also sold during construction to New River Phase II, LLLP, Agenda Item #47 March 25, 2003.

Phase III has yet to be started, but construction is reportedly planned to begin in eighteen (18) months on the County-owned property in Smoker's Park.

New River Village is currently leasing 243 spaces from the County. These 243 parking spaces were required by New River Village in addition to parking in and around the Phase II facility in order to get permission to construct Phase III.

The agreement with New River Village allows for the County to take back the spaces only with the consent of both parties. County staff spoke with Mr. Tracy on 02-21-06. Mr. Tracy indicated he will not release any spaces back to the County, gratis or otherwise, as they are needed for Phase III, which he expects to commence in approximately 18 months. The 243 spaces being leased by New River Village are available for County use when not being used by them. Approximately eighty (80) of the spaces were used by New River Village's contractor during the construction of Phase III, the remainder were available to the County.
