Section 2. Chapter 8 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

PART I. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND GROWTH MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT

8.1. Established; Scope.

There is hereby established an Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department which shall be responsible for the administration and coordination of the County's comprehensive planning and redevelopment programs; consumer protection; emergency management; and protection, restoration, and enhancement of Broward County's natural resources, public health, and environmental quality of life. The Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department shall include the divisions of Animal Care and Adoption; Emergency Management; Planning and Development Management; Environmental Planning and Community Resilience; Environmental Licensing Engineering and Building Permitting; Housing Finance and Community Redevelopment; Environmental and Consumer Protection; and Pollution Prevention Building Code Services. The Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department shall be proactive in balancing the needs of the natural and human community, ensuring a future in which the County's natural and urban resources

are preserved, protected, and enhanced in keeping with federal, state, and Broward County Board of County Commissioners' laws, regulations, rules, and ordinances.

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8.3. Functions; Responsibilities.

The functions and responsibilities of the Department shall include the following:

a. Direct and manage the operations of the divisions of Animal Care and Adoption; Environmental Licensing Engineering and Building Permitting; Environmental and Consumer Protection; Environmental Planning and Management; Community Resilience: Emergency Planning and Development Management; Housing Finance and Community Redevelopment; and Pollution Prevention Building Code Services.

PART III. ENVIRONMENTAL LICENSING ENGINEERING AND BUILDING PERMITTING DIVISION

8.12. Environmental <u>Licensing Engineering</u> and <u>Building</u> Permitting Division Established; Director as Head.

There is hereby established an Environmental Licensing Engineering and Building Permitting Division ("Division") in the Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department ("Department") which shall be responsible for the administration of the County's building code, regulating the use, storage, and disposal of solid waste to protect the environment and health, safety, and welfare of the people of Broward County; identifying and requiring abatement of contaminated sites; supporting Department efforts in resource protection, enforcement, and compliance; administering

the <u>County's</u> water engineering and licensing regulatory program, the aquatic and wetland resources regulatory program, <u>and</u> the tree preservation and abuse regulatory program, <u>and consumer protection functions</u>; and <u>minimizing exposure of the public in Broward County to air pollution and airborne nuisances through programs designed to inform the public and to control emissions from stationary, mobile, and indoor sources. The Division Director shall be the head of the Division. The Division Director shall have a college degree with major course work in engineering, architecture, or related field and at least six (6) years' experience in building, permitting, biological resources programs, <u>or</u> water resources programs, <u>or consumer protection programs</u>, including four (4) years of high level supervisory and administrative experience in planning, <u>air quality</u>, biological resources, or water resources; or any equivalent combination of relevant training and experience.</u>

8.13. Functions; Responsibilities.

The Division shall have the authority to:

- a. Protect the public health, safety, and welfare by ensuring that all construction in the unincorporated areas of Broward County and those cities in Broward County under contract for building code services conform with all applicable ordinances, building codes, laws, rules, resolutions, and regulations in effect in Broward County, Florida.
- b. Administer and enforce the Florida Building Code, Mobile Home Regulations, minimum housing, and such other county ordinances relating to permitting that affect land, property structures, and the environment in the unincorporated areas of Broward County and those cities in Broward County under contract for building code services.

1 Enforce the Florida Building Code by performing plan review, inspections, C. 2 and issuing permits for construction projects. 3 d.
