As we all know the agency is moving forward with equipping every Deputy in the Operations Bureau with Body Worn Cameras (BWC) to increase our accountability and provide a video account of our encounters with the public to secure critical evidence, for the safety of the Deputy and to increase the public's confidence in us by way of full disclosure of our activities.

To facilitate this new initiative we need to purchase 98 BWC bundles (one for each sworn deputy) as each bundle contains the required two cameras, one tablet, cables and mounts. We also need to fund the required IT Hardware necessary to provide for the recording, transmission and storage of the BWC data and construct a room for the secure storage of all the equipment procured.

This total LETF request is for \$79,637.12 out of our current balance of \$281,568.17 in our LETF fund and would allow for the purchase of:

Ninety-Eight (98) Taser International Body Worn Camera Bundles at \$500 each for a total of \$49,000.

The required IT Hardware to implement the program which includes two Cisco 2960 XR Ports, two FG90 Firewalls, one Cisco 819 LTE Router at a one-time cost of \$11,182.00.

This LETF request would also provide funding for the construction of the room within our district that would provide for the secure storage of all the required equipment at a one-time cost of \$19,455,12.

I would like to outline both the Capital and Operating costs associated with the program and memorialize the roles and responsibilities of BSO and those of the Fort Lauderdale – Hollywood International Airport. - For cameras to be fully deployed, the Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport district office must have a completed body camera room with the necessary IT infrastructure to support the data transfer to Evidence.com.

- The construction costs for the body camera room will be the responsibility the Fort Lauderdale – Hollywood International Airport. BSO met with airport command and provided construction, security recommendations and specifications, to include all data and power requirements for the docking stations.
- BSO will make arrangements for the AT&T data circuit to be brought to the building, and will immediately advise if AT&T must perform any digging and/or pull conduit from the street.
- BSO will order the required IT hardware and the associated costs will be reimbursed by the Fort Lauderdale — Hollywood International Airport.
- BSO will install, configure and support all IT and BWC hardware associated with the BWC project at no additional cost.
- Upon completion of the BWC room within the Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport district office, BSO will train and deploy cameras for district personnel.



Due to the sharp increase in the number of vehicle burglaries in the city, as compared to 2016, the Cooper City Commission, at its regular meeting on July 18, 2017, discussed and unanimously supported the purchase of License Plate Readers and has appropriated up to \$162,000 in Federal LETF towards the purchase. The Commission wants to be proactive in trying to help protect the citizens and businesses from becoming the victims of a burglary as expressed in the attached letter from the City Manager. When a vehicle burglary occurs, the LPR is a valuable tool in helping to locate the perpetrator. Additionally, the message board can be used both to curtail speeding as well as being an information source for the public.

Therefore, in conjunction with the City of Cooper City, this is a request to expend Federal LETF to purchase four (4) License Plate Readers from Vetted Security Solutions. Since Federal LETF is now being managed by Broward County, I am respectfully requesting that this purchase request be presented to the Broward County Commission for approval. My understanding is that there is currently \$96,876 in Treasury Fund that we would like to apply to this purchase, prior to using the \$63,420 from the Justice Fund for the remaining balance.

HI Bruce,

As you know we have been discussing digital public safety systems, specifically License Plate Readers (LPR) in the city. Studies have shown that surveillance cameras are effective at reducing crime and essential for identifying suspects, supporting investigations and aiding in the prosecution of perpetrators. LPR's are currently operational in several Broward cities, including Coconut Creek, Fort Lauderdale, Hillsboro Beach, Hollywood, Lauderdale by the Sea, Lighthouse Point, Miramar and Sunrise.

Briefly, LPR's include a series of either fixed or portable cameras that capture a vehicle tag. Character recognition software reads and identifies the tag. The information is then queried against state and national wanted files. Depending on the software purchased, alerts can be placed on "wanted" tags with notification sent to deputies and detectives. For most property crimes, there are no eye witnesses or other definitive evidence for detectives to follow up on. LPR's capture key information about vehicles in the area during a crime, they are often the only evidence available.

Attached you will find some reference materials, including legal rulings in support of LPR, brochures for portable LPR systems, and a Commission Agenda/LETF Proposal for Lauderdale by the Sea for their 2015 LPR purchase. The preferred vendor is NDI, as they are the vendor for several other Broward Municipalities, including Lighthouse Point, Hillsboro Beach and Lauderdale by The Sea. Generally, the portable LPR range in price from \$30,000-\$40,000 each. They operate on batteries with solar back up. Permanent systems are about half that cost; however, require electricity. We still need to have a site visit and official quote from the vendor of choice. Additionally, we need to discuss the location of the host server (i.e. the City, BSO or vendor).
