BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 21 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA: 22 23 24

Section 1. Authorized Appropriations and Disbursements.

The Board hereby authorizes appropriations and disbursements of funds approved during the Supplemental Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 as set forth in Attachment A hereto. Attachment B indicates instances in which an agency failed to meet all of the agreement outcomes.

Section 2. <u>Execution of Agreements by the County Administrator</u>.

The County Administrator is hereby authorized to execute agreements to provide the human support service funding to the agencies set forth on Attachment A, to amend the agreements as authorized therein, and to take any necessary budgetary or administrative actions to implement the agreements. Nothing in this Resolution shall be construed to alter the requirement that any agreements be approved by the Office of the County Attorney prior to execution. Any material deviations from any standard form agreements shall be presented to the Board for its consideration and approval.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.
