## **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Opioid Epidemic Litigation - Selection of Outside Counsel

CAO File: 18-026.00

On January 11, I shortlisted four legal teams to potentially represent the County in the opioid epidemic litigation and stated that I would provide my ranking of those teams by January 19. My stated reason for the delay between shortlisting and ranking was to give each team an opportunity to both develop or enhance its local (Broward) presence and to broaden the diversity of the lawyers who would actively participate in the litigation.

Since January 11, the teams have changed as follows:

A. The following two teams have combined and now constitute one team:

Lieff Cabraser Heimann & Bernstein and Robbins Geller Rudman & Dowd LLP; and

Kopelowitz Ostrow Ferguson Weiselberg Gilbert; Morgan & Morgan; and Haliczer Pettis & Schwamm.

- B. The team of Motley Rice, LLC; Gelber Schachter & Greenberg, P.A.; and Colson Hicks Eidson has added the Law Office of Johnny L. McCray, Jr., PA. Mr. McCray is a Broward-based attorney.
- C. The team of Simmons Hanly Conroy; Crueger Dickinson; and von Briesen & Roper, s.c., has added Kelley Uustal, a Broward-based firm, and specifically included named partners Robert Kelley and John Uustal.

Each of the three teams is formidable and would provide excellent representation to the County. Distinguishing among these teams for purposes of ranking was extremely difficult. As directed, I hereby rank the teams as follows:

<u>First Ranked Team.</u> Lieff Cabraser Heimann & Bernstein; Robbins Geller Rudman & Dowd LLP; Kopelowitz Ostrow Ferguson Weiselberg Gilbert; Morgan & Morgan; and Haliczer Pettis & Schwamm.

<u>Second Ranked Team.</u> Motley Rice, LLC; Gelber Schachter & Greenberg, P.A.; Colson Hicks Eidson; and Law Office of Johnny L. McCray, Jr., PA.

<u>Third Ranked Team</u>. Simmons Hanly Conroy; Crueger Dickinson; von Briesen & Roper, s.c.; and Kelley Uustal.

Attached please find a chart identifying the individual attorneys from each team who would be expected to actively participate in the litigation. The chart also identifies the leadership positions occupied by each team in the federal multidistrict litigation (it is very likely, but not a foregone conclusion, our case will wind up as part of the federal multidistrict litigation rather than be filed and remain in state court).

Each team will be given up to ten minutes on January 23 to present why it believes it should be retained to provide this representation. Team representatives will be available to answer any questions. Senior Assistant County Attorney Angela Benjamin and I are also available to answer any questions regarding the ranking or, more generally, this matter.

A one-way cone of silence is now in effect. Thus, you and your staff may initiate contact with the legal teams to seek information, but the legal teams (and anyone acting on their behalf) must continue to refrain from initiating contact with you or your staff regarding this matter. We will provide any contact information upon request.
