Section 6. Section 31½-75 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 31½-75. Transportation Surtax Oversight Board.

To ensure accountability, objectivity, and transparency in the distribution and expenditure of Transportation Surtax proceeds, there is hereby established an independent Transportation Surtax Oversight Board (the "Oversight Board") to review and approve proposed transportation projects funded, in whole or part, with Transportation Surtax proceeds, for consistency with the requirements of Section 212.055(1), Florida Statutes, and any applicable interlocal agreements. Transportation projects shall be funded with Transportation Surtax proceeds as approved by the Transportation Surtax Oversight Board.

(a) Composition. The Oversight Board shall be comprised of the following nine (9) members: one (1) professional in each of the following fields: accounting, finance, land use or urban planner, law, engineering or construction management, architecture, and environmental science; one former elected official; and one former city or county manager. None of the members shall, at any time during their term, be an elected official or have an employment or contractual relationship with, or be employed by any entity that has a contractual relationship with, Broward County. The following five (5) persons (collectively, the "Appointing Authority"), none of whom may be a current elected official, shall, based on procedures established by majority vote, make nominations for members and shall, also by majority vote, appoint members on or before May 1, 2017 (any designee may be removed and replaced at any time by the designor):

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1	1. The Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, District
2	4, or an employee of District 4 designated by the Secretary;
3	2. The designee of the Broward Workshop:
4	3. The designee of the Broward County Council of Chambers (of
5	Commerce):
6	4. The Broward County Auditor, or the Auditor's designee; and
7	5. The Director of the Florida Atlantic University Center for
8	Environmental Studies, or such person's designee.
9	(b) Term of Oversight Board Members. Oversight Board members shall serve
10	four-year terms and may be reappointed for successive terms. Members may be
11	removed for good cause determined by supermajority vote of the Appointing Authority,
12	and may be removed by a majority vote of the Appointing Authority if the member no
13	longer meets the qualifications for membership. Any member appointed to replace a
14	member who has been removed or who resigns shall serve for the balance of the term
15	of such member. The Appointing Authority shall meet as required to appoint or remove
16	members.
17	(c) Oversight Board Meetings. The Oversight Board shall meet quarterly.
18	The members shall elect a chairperson to preside over meetings. The Oversight Board
19	shall establish its own rules of procedure for conducting its meetings.
20	(d) Staffing. Broward County shall provide sufficient staff to enable the
21	Oversight Board to efficiently perform its functions, and shall retain such consultants as
22	the Oversight Board determines necessary to perform its responsibilities.
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1	(e) Approval of Projects. All applications for projects funded by
2	Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be submitted to the Oversight Board, which shall
3	determine whether the project, as described in the project application, is permissible
4	under Section 212.055(1)(d)(4). If the Oversight Board determines that it is permissible
5	the Oversight Board shall approve the project and shall send written notice thereof to
6	Broward County Administrator. If an approved project is only partially fundable with
7	Transportation Surtax proceeds pursuant to Section 212.055(1)(d)(4), the Oversight
8	Board's written approval shall identify those portions of the project fundable with
9	Transportation Surtax proceeds and shall state the total dollar value of those portions
10	The written notice of approval may contain recommendations made by the Oversight
11	Board regarding best practices or other methods that may be employed to improve the
12	project. If the Oversight Board determines that a proposed project is not permissible
13	under Section 212.055(1)(d)(4), Florida Statutes, the Oversight Board shall reject the
14	project and shall, in writing, specify the reasons why the project was rejected. Rejected
15	projects may be modified and resubmitted for subsequent consideration by the
16	Oversight Board. The Oversight Board shall issue its written notice of project approva
17	or rejection within one hundred twenty (120) days of its receipt of a completed project
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(f) Project Oversight. All approved projects shall be subject to the Oversight Board's review, critique, and analysis for the duration of the project. The Oversight Board shall issue annual reports on the performance of ongoing projects and shall provide recommendations for any proposed performance improvements.

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1	(f)(g) Annual Audits. Broward County shall retain an independent certified
2	public accountant to perform and complete an annual audit of all projects approved by
3	the Oversight Board and of all Transportation Surtax proceeds received, maintained,
4	and expended.
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
