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11	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida
12	("Board"), desires to amend the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code") to codify
13	the requirement that certain individuals obtain Airport Issued Identification Media; and
14	WHEREAS, the Board additionally desires to amend the Code to require that
15	individuals with Airport Issued Identification Media complete the emergency response
16	training required by the Broward County Aviation Department, and that the employers of
17	such individuals compensate them for the time spent completing the emergency
18	response training; and
19	WHEREAS, the Board finds that the implementation of this Ordinance, as set
20	forth herein, promotes, protects, and improves the health, safety, and welfare of the
21	residents and visitors of Broward County, Florida,
22	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
23	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:
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Section 1. Section 2-2 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-2. Definitions.

(e) Airport Issued Identification Media shall mean the pictured security identification badge issued by the Department which is magnetically encoded to permit controlled access through the Airport's computerized access system and that serves as the officially recognized security identification for access to the AOA as required by federal regulations at FLL.

Section 2. Section 2-43 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-43. Reserved Airport Issued Identification Media and Emergency Response Training.

- (a) All individuals who require unescorted access to the SIDA, the AOA, or any portion of FLL in which certain security measures specified in 49 CFR Part 1542 are carried out, must obtain Airport Issued Identification Media in accordance with the procedures, rules, and requirements of the Airport Security Program.
- (b) Commencing upon the date specified by the Aviation Director and no later than December 31, 2018, all employees, agents, representatives, contractors, and subcontractors of any person or entity holding an agreement with the County for operations at FLL, including, but not limited to, a Field Usage Agreement, an Airline Service Provider Agreement, and any other lease, sublease, license, operating, construction, or concession agreement, must obtain Airport Issued Identification Media

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in accordance with the procedures, rules, and requirements of the Aviation Department, unless the Aviation Director, in his or her sole discretion, determines Airport Issued Identification Media is not required or unless otherwise required to obtain Airport Issued Identification Media in accordance with Section 2-43(a).

- required to obtain Airport Issued Identification Media ("Airport Personnel") must complete the emergency response training required by the Aviation Department before the issuance of such Airport Issued Identification Media and before each renewal thereof. Airport Personnel who obtained Airport Issued Identification Media before the effective date specified by the Aviation Director pursuant to this Section 2-43(c) shall complete such training after such effective date but before December 31, 2018, or before the renewal of any Airport Issued Identification Media, whichever occurs first, and before each subsequent renewal.
- Airport Personnel at the pay rate applicable to such Airport Personnel for the time spent completing the emergency response training required by this Section 2-43, and such employers shall follow all procedures, rules, and requirements of the Aviation Department regarding Airport Issued Identification Media.

Section 3. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any Court determines that this Ordinance, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies),

or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any 1 2 other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance. 3 Section 4. INCLUSION IN CODE. 4 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of 5 this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Code; and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word 6 "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or 7 phrase in order to accomplish such intentions. 8 9 Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.
