to remedy the violation. If after ten (10) days the violation has not been remedied, the
County may remove the offending tree and shall place a lien on the property in the amount
of the removal cost. The County shall have the authority to immediately remove any
dead, severely diseased, or damaged tree and shall place a lien on the property in the
amount of the removal cost if:

- (1) The tree presents an imminent danger to safety, property, or utilities; and
- (2) The County Administrator has suspended compliance with Chapter 27, Article XIV, of the Code pursuant to Section 27-406 of the Code.
- (e) Failure of a property owner within a homeowners' association, as defined in Section 720.301, Florida Statutes, to comply with subsections (b), (c), and (d) above, where compliance would conflict with the Declaration of Restrictive Covenants, by-laws, or regulations of the homeowners' association, shall not be deemed a violation of this section. Upon a showing by the property owner of said conflict, any notice of violation issued pursuant to this section shall be dismissed by the code enforcement officer or hearing officer, as applicable.
- (f) Unless otherwise specified in this section, property owners subject to an enforcement action shall receive a notice of violation in accordance with Section 39-134 prior to any action being taken against them and may appeal the decision pursuant to Chapter 8½ of the Code prior to the time limit to remedy the violation.
- (f) (g) Any person who violates the requirements set forth in this section shall be subject to fines as set forth in Section 8½-16(a) of the Code. Each incident involving each tree shall be considered a separate violation of this article.
