ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY. FLORIDA. RELATING TO THE CHARTER COUNTY AND REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION SALES SYSTEM SURTAX ("TRANSPORTATION SURTAX"); REPLACING BROWARD COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2016-32 RELATING ARTICLE OF CHAPTER 31½ OF THE BROWARD ("CODE") COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES , FOR THE PURPOSE OF LEVYING, SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY REFERENDUM, PERCENT ONE TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY (30) YEARS: CREATING A SEGREGATED TRUST FUND TRANSPORTATION INTO WHICH ALL PROCEEDS SHALL BE DEPOSITED: PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF Α TRANSPORTATION SURTAX OVERSIGHT BOARD TO **OVERSEE** THE USE TRANSPORTATION SURTAX PROCEEDS **AUTHORIZED** TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSIT PURPOSES; **PROVIDING** FOR **AMENDMENTS** AND SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 212.055(1), Florida Statutes, provides for the levy of a Charter County and Regional Transportation System Sales Surtax ("Transportation Surtax") through enactment of an ordinance, subject to approval by a majority of the countywide electors voting in a referendum election on the Transportation Surtax; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida (the "Board"), enacted Ordinance No. 2016-32 to levy, subject to approval by countywide referendum, a Transportation Surtax at a rate of one-half percent (0.5%) for a period of twenty (20) years (the "2016 Transportation Surtax Ballot Question"); and

WHEREAS, the 2016 Transportation Surtax Ballot Question was approved by a majority of the voters casting a ballot thereon in the November 2016 general election; and

WHEREAS, according to the ballot language, the 2016 Transportation Surtax Ballot Question would not be effectuated unless both it and a separate infrastructure surtax ballot measure received a majority vote of the participating electorate; and

WHEREAS, the infrastructure surtax ballot measure did not receive majority support, and therefore Ordinance No. 2016-32 was repealed by operation of law and no Transportation Surtax went into effect; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to levy a Transportation Surtax, as further described below, to be considered by the countywide voters at the General Election on November 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, if the Transportation Surtax is approved by referendum at the General Election on November 6, 2018, the proceeds of the Transportation Surtax shall be expended for transportation and transit purposes authorized in Section 212.055(1)(d), Florida Statutes, including: (1) for the planning, development, operation, and maintenance of roads and bridges, bus systems, fixed guideway rapid transit systems, and on-demand transportation services; (2) for the payment of principal and interest on bonds issued for authorized transportation and transit projects; and (3) as a pledge for bonds issued for such authorized transportation and transit projects, with oversight of expenditures by an independent Transportation Surtax Oversight Board; and

WHEREAS, to provide essential funding for critical transportation and transit needs for the benefit of present and future generations, the Board desires for the levy of the Transportation Surtax to remain in effect for a period of thirty (30) years ending on December 31, 2048, at which time the Transportation Surtax shall automatically sunset and expire,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Article V, including Sections 31½-71 through 31½-75, of Chapter 31½ of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby replaced to read as follows:

ARTICLE V. BROWARD COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SURTAX

Sec. 31½-71. Short title.

This article shall be known and may be cited as the "Broward County Transportation Surtax Ordinance."

Sec. 31½-72. Levy of Transportation Surtax.

Pursuant to Section 212.055(1), Florida Statutes, and subject to approval by a majority of the qualified electors of Broward County voting in a referendum at the General Election on November 6, 2018 ("Ballot Measure"), there is hereby levied, for a period of thirty (30) years, commencing at 12:01 a.m. on January 1, 2019, and expiring at 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2048, a one percent (1%) Charter County and Regional Transportation System Sales Surtax ("Transportation Surtax") on all transactions taxable pursuant to Section 212.054(2) Florida Statutes, including the first Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) of the sales amount of any items of tangible personal property, subject to certain exceptions as further provided by Florida law.

Sec. 31½-73. Transportation Surtax Trust Fund.

There is hereby created the Broward County Transportation Surtax Trust Fund ("Trust Fund") into which all Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be deposited. Broward County is authorized to establish accounts and subaccounts within the Trust Fund as may be necessary or useful for administering the Transportation Surtax proceeds in compliance with all legal requirements. Broward County is authorized and directed to take such additional steps as necessary or useful under generally accepted governmental accounting principles to ensure that balances in the accounts and subaccounts of the Trust Fund at the end of each fiscal year carry forward to the subsequent fiscal year. The designation and establishment of the Trust Fund, and the various accounts and subaccounts therein, shall be in keeping with generally accepted governmental accounting principles. Cash and investments required to be accounted for in the Trust Fund may not be comingled with any other funds, including other transportation or transit funds.

Sec. 31½-74. Use of Transportation Surtax proceeds.

Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be collected, allocated, disbursed, and expended for authorized transportation and transit purposes, in accordance with Sections 212.054 and 212.055(1), Florida Statutes.

Sec. 31½-75. Transportation Surtax Oversight Board.

To ensure accountability, objectivity, and transparency in the expenditure of Transportation Surtax proceeds, there is hereby established an independent Transportation Surtax Oversight Board (the "Oversight Board"). The Oversight Board shall review and approve proposed transportation projects funded, in whole or part, with Transportation Surtax proceeds, for consistency with the requirements of

- (a) <u>Composition</u>. The Oversight Board shall be comprised of the following nine (9) members: one (1) professional in each of the following fields: accounting, finance, land use or urban planning, law, engineering or construction management, architecture, and environmental science; one (1) former elected official; and one (1) former city or county manager. None of the members shall, at any time during their term, be an elected official or have an employment or contractual relationship with, or be employed by any entity that has a contractual relationship with, Broward County. The following five (5) persons (collectively, the "Appointing Authority"), none of whom may be a current elected official, shall, based on procedures established by majority vote, make nominations for members and shall, also by majority vote, appoint members on or before May 1, 2019 (any designee may be removed and replaced at any time by the designor):
- 1. The Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, District 4, or an employee of District 4 designated by the Secretary;
 - 2. The designee of the Broward Workshop;
- 3. The designee of the Broward County Council of Chambers (of Commerce);
 - 4. The Broward County Auditor or the Auditor's designee; and
- 5. The Director of the Florida Atlantic University Center for Environmental Studies or such person's designee.

- (b) Term of Oversight Board Members. Oversight Board members shall serve four-year terms and may be reappointed for successive terms. Members may be removed for good cause determined by supermajority vote of the Appointing Authority, and may be removed by a majority vote of the Appointing Authority if the members no longer meet the qualifications for membership. Any member appointed to replace a member who has been removed or who resigns shall serve for the balance of the term of such member. The Appointing Authority shall meet as required to appoint or remove members.
- (c) <u>Oversight Board Meetings</u>. The Oversight Board shall meet quarterly. The members shall elect a chairperson to preside over meetings. The Oversight Board shall establish its own rules of procedure for conducting its meetings.
- (d) <u>Staffing</u>. Broward County shall provide sufficient staff to enable the Oversight Board to efficiently perform its functions, and shall retain such consultants as the Oversight Board determines necessary to perform its responsibilities.
- Approval of Projects. All applications for projects funded (e) Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be submitted to the Oversight Board, which shall determine whether the project, as described in the project application, is permissible under Section 212.055(1)(d)(4), Florida Statutes. If the Oversight Board determines that it is permissible, the Oversight Board shall approve the project and shall send written notice thereof to the Broward County Administrator. If an approved project is only partially fundable with Transportation Surtax proceeds pursuant Section 212.055(1)(d)(4), Florida Statutes, the Oversight Board's written approval shall identify those portions of the project fundable with Transportation Surtax proceeds and

shall state the total dollar value of those portions. The written notice of approval may contain recommendations made by the Oversight Board regarding best practices or other methods that may be employed to improve the project. If the Oversight Board determines that a proposed project is not permissible under Section 212.055(1)(d)(4), Florida Statutes, the Oversight Board shall reject the project and shall, in writing, specify the reasons why the project was rejected. Rejected projects may be modified and resubmitted for subsequent consideration by the Oversight Board. The Oversight Board shall issue its written notice of project approval or rejection within one hundred twenty (120) days after receipt of a completed project application.

- (f) <u>Project Oversight</u>. All approved projects shall be subject to the Oversight Board's review, critique, and analysis for the duration of the project. The Oversight Board shall issue annual reports on the performance of ongoing projects and shall provide recommendations for any proposed performance improvements.
- (g) Annual Audits. Broward County shall retain an independent certified public accountant to perform and complete annual audits of all projects approved by the Oversight Board and of all Transportation Surtax proceeds received, maintained, and expended.

Section 2. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>.

The Board may amend, revise, or repeal this Transportation Surtax Ordinance in the manner provided by law. However, no repeal, amendment, or revision of this Transportation Surtax Ordinance, or reduction in the rate of the Transportation Surtax, may take effect if it would materially impair the contract rights of the owners of any

bonds, notes, or other instruments of indebtedness payable in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, from the proceeds of the Transportation Surtax.

Section 3. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any Court determines that this Ordinance, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies), or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 4. INCLUSION IN CODE.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Code; and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- (a) This Ordinance shall become effective as provided by law.
- (b) Repeal Upon Electorate Disapproval. If the levy of the Transportation Surtax is not approved by a majority of the electors of Broward County voting in the referendum at the General Election on November 6, 2018, this Transportation Surtax Ordinance shall expire and be deemed repealed in its entirety on December 31, 2018, without further action by the Board.

(c) Sunset. Except as provided in Section 5(b) above, the Transportation Surtax shall "sunset" and expire on December 31, 2048, at 11:59 p.m., without further action by the Board, at which time the Transportation Surtax levied hereunder shall be deemed repealed, terminated, and of no further force and effect, except that the requirements of this Ordinance relating to the administration, use, or oversight of Transportation Surtax proceeds shall survive the expiration of the Transportation Surtax, and shall be fully enforceable in a court of competent jurisdiction.
