**LETF FUNDS** 

BSO Port Everglades is requesting approval to transfer funds from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) funds into the District's Capital Fund (23250-42250) for FY18. Attached is a copy of the LETF Sharing Program Recap (dated February 16, 2018) which shows \$314,301 is currently available. The LETF funds will be utilized to purchase thirty (30) Public Access Bleeding Control Stations that will be strategically positioned next to the Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) that are already stationed throughout Port Everglades.

The mass shootings at the Fort Lauderdale Hollywood International Airport and Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School have taught first responders that Tactical Emergency Medical Services (TEMS) are vital toward the preservation of life. It is imperative to stop the bleeding quickly and to have bleeding control supplies (tourniquets and dressings) close by and easy to access.

The Broward Sheriff's Office, Port Everglades Departments of Law Enforcement and Fire Rescue have embarked on multiple training initiatives to prepare first responders and civilian Port employees and tenants with the most current life safety curriculum with regards to patient access and bleeding control. The lesson plans currently being taught include Rescue Task Force (RTF), Civilian Bleeding Control (B-CON), and Contact Treatment and Extraction (CTE). As of today, 218 civilian Port Everglades employees and tenants have received the B-CON training and 391 first responders have received RTF training. The newest development of training is CTE which is scheduled to commence the first week of June, 2018.

The cost for the Public Access Bleeding Control Stations will be \$1,500 each (total \$45,000) and the funds will be allocated strictly to the one-time expense of \$45,000 for the purchase of thirty (30) stations that will be installed throughout Port Everglades. The approval of the LETF funds for this project will enable Port Everglades to be one of the first seaports to have these lifesaving kits available to the public.

Your consideration of this request is appreciated.



# Trauma surgeon takes lead on campaign to train police, bystanders on bleeding control

The team is partnering with EMS providers to conduct the largest "Stop the Bleed" campaign in New Jersey

NEWARK, N.J. — A team is directing a campaign to teach law enforcement and civilians how to control bleeding during emergency situations.

The team, led by Rutgers New Jersey Medical School trauma surgeon Adam Fox, is partnering with EMS providers from University Hospital to conduct the largest "Stop the Bleed" campaign in the state.

"A person can die from blood loss within minutes, so it is imperative to stop the bleeding quickly," Fox said. "Although we don't know the data yet, the scenario in Las Vegas, where there were thousands of concertgoers, could potentially have had dramatically different outcomes if the public knew how to stop bleeding and were armed with the proper tools. People bleeding out from a leg or arm wound would have a greater chance of survival."

"Stop the Bleed" is a national awareness program that empowers people to train and learn how to help with hemorrhage control before responders arrive. Fox's team has trained over 500 responders and civilians.

The campaign consists of a 45-minute course that shows people how to use a tourniquet, pack a wound and stop bleeding with direct pressure. Additionally, a legislation campaign is being planned in order to place bleeding kits in public areas that contain

tourniquets, pressure dressings and gauze.

"Unfortunately, there is no legislation in the country that mandates bleeding control equipment in public spaces," Fox said. "However, we are working with multiple agencies, including the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, to eventually make these kits available to the public. A legislative campaign is planned for after the election."
