WHEREAS, Article VI of the Broward County Charter ("Charter") provides for a Charter Review Commission, which was appointed in 2015, to meet and to propose changes to the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the required two-thirds majority of the Charter Review Commission has voted to submit eleven (11) proposed Charter amendments to the electorate; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Commission has held at least two (2) public hearings regarding the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.02 of the Charter provides that the Broward County Board of County Commissioners "shall place the Charter Review Commission's proposed amendments and/or revisions with the associated ballot language approved by the Charter Review Commission on the general election ballot at the next general election"; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 11.09 of the Charter, the County Auditor has reviewed the proposed amendments and provided Financial Impact Statements for each, which are also required to be placed on the ballot, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. A referendum election is called and ordered to be held in conjunction with the general election to be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, and at such other times as provided for early voting by Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, throughout Broward County, Florida, for the purpose of determining whether or not the Charter amendments/revisions stated herein, which are formally proposed by the Charter Review Commission as evidenced by the attached Charter Review Commission resolutions, shall be adopted.

Section 3. The election shall be held between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on November 6, 2018, and at such other days and times for early voting as provided by Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, at the same polling places established in Broward County for the general election to be held on the prescribed date. Mail-in ballots for the referendum election shall be prepared and made available as provided by law. All registered and qualified electors in Broward County shall be eligible to vote in this referendum election.

Section 4. Pursuant to Section 100.342, Florida Statutes, at least thirty (30) days' notice of the referendum election, including its purpose and eligibility requirements for voting, shall be published by the County Administrator in a newspaper of general circulation in Broward County. The publication shall be made at least three (3) times, once in the seventh week, once in the fifth week, and once in the third week, prior to the

week in which the election is held. The notice shall contain the complete text of the proposed Charter amendments as shown in Sections 5 through 15 of this Resolution.

Section 5. The title and wording of the Charter Review Commission's first question are as follows (inclusive of the financial impact statement prepared by the Broward County Auditor):

STANDARDS FOR ESTABLISHING COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICTS

Shall the Broward County Charter be amended to provide that county commission districts may not be drawn to favor or disfavor an incumbent or political party; that districts shall not be drawn to deny racial or language minorities the equal opportunity to participate in the political process and elect representatives of their choice; and to ensure that districts are contiguous and as equal in population as feasible?

Section 18. Should a majority of the electors voting in the referendum election vote "YES," as to any of the ballot questions specified in Sections 5 through 15 of this Resolution, thereby approving the measure, the applicable amendment and/or revision shall become a part of the Charter of Broward County, Florida.

Section 19. In accordance with Section 4 of Charter Review Commission Resolutions 2018-002 through 2018-008 and 2018-10 through 2018-13, the County Attorney is authorized to make changes to the numbers and/or letters affixed to the Articles, Sections, and Paragraphs of the Charter in order to conform the Charter to the amendments/revisions approved by the electors of Broward County. In making any codification modifications pursuant to this section, the County Attorney may rely upon the legislative intent of the Charter Review Commission, and the base document(s) from which the varied proposals attached to this Resolution were developed.

Section 20. The County Administrator, as Clerk of the Broward County Board of County Commissioners, shall furnish a certified copy of this adopted enabling Resolution to the Supervisor of Elections for Broward County by June 18, 2018. The County

WHEREAS, the Charter of Broward County, Florida provides that all amendments and revisions proposed by the Charter Review Commission must be presented by the County Commission to the electorate at the next general election;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BROWARD COUNTY CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION:

SECTION 1: That pursuant to Section 6.02 of the Charter of Broward County, Florida, the County Commission is hereby directed to place on the ballot for presentation to the electorate, at a special referendum election to be held in conjunction with the November 2018 General Election, a special referendum issue, the subject of which is proposed to amend Section 2.01, entitled "Composition, terms, qualifications, and compensation of members," to provide for fair standards for the establishment of County Commission district boundaries, the full text of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein as Exhibit "A".

SECTION 2: That the ballot title and summary for the proposed amendments/revisions as referred to above shall appear as follows:

EXHIBIT "A"

Proposed Charter Language Regarding Standards for Establishing County Commission District Boundaries

* * *

Article II - Legislative Branch: County Commission

Sec. 2.01. - Composition, redistricting, terms, qualifications, and compensation of members.

The County Commission comprises the Legislative Branch of County government empowered to enact ordinances and resolutions, and to take action that is consistent with this Charter and that is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the County's citizens.

- A. The County Commission shall be composed of nine (9) members elected from single-member districts.
 - (1) No later than December 31st of the year of publication of each decennial census, the County Commission shall divide the County into nine (9) single-member districts of contiguous territory as nearly as equal in population as practicable, utilizing the most recent decennial census, as provided for herein. If, as a result of redistricting, Commissioners no longer reside in the District they were elected to represent, the Commissioners may remain in office, and serve out the balance of their term.

<u>Standards for Establishing County Commission District Boundaries – In establishing County Commission boundaries:</u>

- (a) No apportionment plan or district shall be drawn with the intent to favor or disfavor a political party or an incumbent; and districts shall not be drawn with the intent or result of denying or abridging the equal opportunity of racial or language minorities to participate in the political process or to diminish their ability to elect representatives of their choice; and districts shall consist of contiguous territory.
- (b) Unless compliance with the standards in this subsection conflicts with the standards in subsection 1(a) or with federal law, districts shall be as nearly equal in population as is practicable; districts shall be compact; and districts shall, where feasible, utilize existing political and geographical boundaries.
- (c) The order in which the standards within subsections 1(a) and (b) of this section are set forth shall not be read to establish any priority of one standard over the other within that subsection.

- (1)(2) Each District shall be assigned a number from one (1) through nine (9). Commissioners from Districts 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 shall be elected in the 2004 general election for a term of four (4) years. Commissioners from Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 elected in 2002 shall serve for a term of four (4) years.

Proposed Charter Language Regarding Redistricting Procedures

* * *

Article II - Legislative Branch: County Commission

Sec. 2.01. - Composition, redistricting, terms, qualifications, and compensation of members.

The County Commission comprises the Legislative Branch of County government empowered to enact ordinances and resolutions, and to take action that is consistent with this Charter and that is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the County's citizens.

- A. The County Commission shall be composed of nine (9) members elected from single-member districts.
 - (1) No later than December 31st of the year of publication of each decennial census, the County Commission shall divide the County into nine (9) singlemember districts of contiguous territory as nearly as equal in population as practicable, utilizing the most recent decennial census. If, as a result of redistricting, Commissioners no longer reside in the District they were elected to represent, the Commissioners may remain in office, and serve out the balance of their term. Following the decennial census in 2020, and every ten (10) years thereafter, or sooner if it is determined by the County Commission that districts have become unbalanced due to population shifts, the County Commission shall contract with an accredited public four (4) year college or university located within the State of Florida for the purpose of identifying and designating nine (9) single-member districts within Broward County. The process utilized by the college or university shall be open and transparent. The County Commission shall adopt a redistricting plan as designated, provided that the plan is consistent with the requirements of federal law, state law and this charter. If, as a result of redistricting, a Commission member no longer resides in the district they were elected to represent, the Commission member may remain in office and serve out that balance of their term. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to alter the residency requirements for any candidate, including incumbents, during subsequent regular elections.
 - (2) Each District shall be assigned a number from one (1) through nine (9). Commissioners from Districts 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 shall be elected in the 2004 general election for a term of four (4) years. Commissioners from Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 elected in 2002 shall serve for a term of four (4) years.
 - (3) Only qualified electors residing within each District may vote for the Commissioner representing that District. Each Commissioner must be an elector of the County and must be a resident of the particular District upon election.

Article XI – General Provisions

Section 11.11 - Broward County Affordable Housing Trust Fund

- A. Broward County Affordable Housing Trust Fund established. The Broward County Affordable Housing Trust Fund ("Trust Fund") is hereby established. - <u>C.</u> Purpose of Trust Fund. The Trust Fund will be used to create and sustain affordable housing throughout Broward County for renters and homeowners, and increase workforce housing opportunities.
- <u>D.</u> *Revenue sources.* The Trust Fund established under this Section shall be funded by the County Commission, and may be comprised of the following sources:
 - (1) <u>Broward County General Revenue appropriated to the Trust Fund by the County Commission as part of the annual budget;</u>
 - (2) <u>Savings from Expired Tax Increment Financing Payments to Community Redevelopment Agencies within the County,</u>
 - (3) Funds voluntarily contributed by municipalities who may elect to participate in the Trust Fund and programs funded by the Trust Fund;
 - (4) Grants or donations made to the Trust Fund;
 - (5) <u>Mandatory or voluntary payments made pursuant to the development policies</u> established by ordinance;
 - (6) Other sources as established by ordinance.
- E. Continuing Nature of Trust Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, unspent portions of the Trust Fund established under this Section, repayments of principal and interest on loans provided from the Trust Fund, and interest earned from the deposit or investment of monies from the Trust Fund:
 - (1) Shall remain in the Trust Fund, to be used exclusively for the purposes of the Trust Fund.

Article I – Creation of County and Powers of Government

Section 1.07 – Required Posting of Notices, Agendas, and Backup Materials

A. Posting of Notices, Agenda, and Backup Materials.

For all meetings subject to the requirements of Section 286.011, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time, and in addition to any applicable state law requirements, the County and all Municipalities shall post on their respective websites any required notices, agendas, and available backup materials at least 48 hours prior to the applicable scheduled meeting. Any revisions to the agenda, backup materials, or other information received or developed by the governmental entity within 48 hours prior to the scheduled meeting shall be posted on the applicable website as soon as practicable after the governmental entity's receipt or development of the agenda materials, and shall be made available for public inspection at the meeting. For any Municipality that does not maintain its own website, the County shall provide, upon request by the Municipality, a location on the County's website to enable the Municipality to meet the requirements of this Section. The County may recover the cost of posting the aforementioned materials on the County's website. All meeting notices subject to this Section shall include the date, time, and location of the meeting, the proposed agenda, and all backup materials received or developed in connection with each agenda item.

B. Exception for Emergency Meetings.

In those instances where there is a County or Municipal meeting subject to Section 286.011, Florida Statutes, scheduled due to an emergency, and it is not possible to post the meeting notice at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the County or Municipality, as applicable, as prescribed above, shall be required to post the meeting notice on its website, or on the County's website if the Municipality does not maintain its own website, at the earliest practicable time. In the written notice calling for the emergency meeting, the chief administrative officer of the County or Municipality shall include a detailed statement explaining the emergency nature of the meeting.

Article IV - County Auditor

Sectoion 4.01 – County Auditor

- A. Effective January 1, 20032018, there shall be an independent board comprised of the following individuals who shall nominate an individual to the position of County Auditor, subject to ratification by a majority of the County Commission on or before July 1, 20032018:
 - (1) State of Florida Auditor General President of the Florida Institute of Certified Public Accountants, or designee;
 - (2) President of the Broward County League of Cities, or designee;
 - (3) President of the Broward County Bar Association, or designee;
 - (4) President of Broward Community College a local college or university, as determined by the County Commission, or designee; and
 - (5) An individual representative from a countywide business organization, which organization is selected by the County Commission President of the Institute of Internal Auditors, or designee.

In the event the State of Florida Auditor Generalthat any of these individuals declines to appoint a member to the independent board, an-additional individual-representatives shall be appointed from a-countywide business organizations, which organizations is shall be selected by the County Commission. The intent of this provision is to ensure that there are five (5) members on the independent board who nominate an individual to the position of County Auditor.

Section 3.08 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Given the importance of transportation services, the responsibilities for County transportation services shall be integrated and afforded a highly visible and prominent position within the organization of County Administration to include an Office of Transportation or a Department of Transportation.

Section 11.06 BROWARD COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL BOARD

All existing rules and regulations adopted prior to the effective date of this Section, January 7, 1991, by the Broward County Environmental Quality Control Board shall remain effective and may thereafter be amended by ordinance adopted by the County Commission.

Section 11.08 BROWARD COUNTY ETHICS COMMISSION

- A. There shall be a Broward County Ethics Commission whose sole purpose shall be to establish a Code of Ethics for the Broward County Commission. The Broward County Ethics Commission shall work in a collaborative and communicative nature with the County Commission in drafting the Code of Ethics. The Broward County Ethics Commission shall present a Code of Ethics to the Broward County Commission for consideration no later than at the first County Commission meeting in March 2010 (the "Proposed Ethics Code"). If the Broward County Commission fails to adopt the Proposed Ethics Code as proposed by the Broward County Ethics Commission within one hundred eighty (180) days of its receipt of the proposal, the Proposed Ethics Code shall be presented to the electors of Broward County for consideration at the November 2010 general election. If approved by the electors of Broward County, the Proposed Ethics Code shall become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances.
- B. Membership. The Broward County Ethics Commission shall be comprised of eleven (11) voting members. Each County Commissioner shall appoint one (1) member from their respective districts, and two (2) county- wide members shall be appointed by the Broward League of Cities.
- C. Quorum. A quorum, necessary to conduct Broward County Ethics Commission business, shall consist of a majority of the Broward County Ethics Commission members.

- D. Term and Vacancies. Broward County Ethics Commission members shall serve until a Code of Ethics is ad-opted by either the Broward County Commission or the electors of Broward County. If a member fails to attend any three (3) consecutive meetings of the Broward County Ethics Commission, that member shall be considered to have vacated his or her seat, and the vacancy shall be filled by appointment pursuant to Subsection B.
- E. Meetings. The Broward County Ethics Commission shall hold its first meeting as soon as practicable after the appointment of its inaugural Board but no later than March 1, 2009. The Commission shall meet as needed and shall hold no less than eight (8) meetings.
- F. Chair and Vice-Chair. At the first meeting of the Broward County Ethics Commission, the members shall appoint a Chair and Vice-Chair. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall serve for the duration of the Broward County Ethics Commission's existence.
- G. Sunset. The Broward County Ethics Commission shall cease to exist upon adoption of the Proposed Ethics Code by the Broward County Commission or upon the consideration of the Proposed Ethics Code by the electors of Broward County, regardless of the outcome.
