13	WHEREAS, the Board has determined that adopting a categorical draw method to		
14	select members and amending the membership categories of the Broward County Animal		
15	Care Advisory Committee is appropriate at this time, NOW, THEREFORE,

20	Section 1. Section 12.290 of the Broward County Administrative Code		
21	regarding the Broward County Animal Care Advisory Committee is hereby amended to

a. The Advisory Committee shall be composed of eighteen (18) eleven (11)				
voting members, all \underline{each} of whom shall be \underline{a} residents of Broward County $\underline{and\ appointe}$				
by the Board of County Commissioners ("Board"). The Board shall appoint two (2				
members of the Advisory Committee at large, neither of whom shall meet any of the				
categorical requirements set forth below. Each Additionally, each Broward Count				
Commissioner shall appoint two (2) nominate one (1) members to the Advisory				
Committee, one of whom shall reside within the appointing commissioner's district using				
the categorical draw method established by the Intergovernmental Affairs/Board				
Section. The required membership categories shall include are:				

- A veterinarian licensed by the State of Florida who is currently practicing veterinary medicine in Broward County, who is a member of the Broward County Veterinarian Medical Association (BCVMA), and whose practice consists primarily of caring for domestic animals;
- A member of an animal welfare organization <u>full-time employee of a nationally recognized animal welfare organization (e.g., The Humane Society of the United States, Best Friends Animal Society, American Humane, Society of Animal Welfare Administrators, American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the National Federation of Human Societies, etc.);
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- A member of a local, nonprofit organization providing <u>support or</u> services to stray or unwanted animals;
- 4. An animal behaviorist A certified applied animal behaviorist who has a bachelor of science or bachelor of arts degree in animal psychology.

2		additional training and/or education in applied animal behavior;	
3	5.	A member from an animal regulatory agency full-time employee (supervisor,	
4		manager, director, etc.) of a municipal animal regulatory agency

6	6.	A member from a law enforcement agency full-time employee (supervisor,	
7		manager, director, etc.) of a law enforcement agency;	
8	7.	A member of a wildlife animal rescue organization full-time employee or	
9		active board member from a wildlife or large animal rescue organization	
10		who has at least one (1) year of experience actively managing operations	
11		in the organization;	
12	8.	An owner or full-time employee of the pet retail industry, partner, or officer	
13		of a pet retail store who resides in Broward County, and whose business	
14		represents the local sales market; and	
15	9.	A member from the State of Florida Broward County Health Department	
16		full-time employee (supervisor, manager, director, etc.) from the State of	
17		Florida Broward County Health Department, or someone who specializes in	
18		epidemiology, zoonotic, or communicable diseases.
