4	INCENTIVE PROGRAM; AMENDING SECTIONS 29.14 THROUGH 29.17 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY								
5	ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE") INCLUDING TO CREATE A SECOND APPLICATION								
6	CYCLE FOR THE TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX CAPITAL CHALLENGE GRANT PROGRAM IN SECTION 29.16; AND								
7	PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

9	WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board")								
10	annually considers applications for the award of Tourist Development Tax Capital								
11	Challenge Grant Program ("TDTCCGP") grants before its annual summer recess; and								
12	WHEREAS, there have been instances where not all available TDTCCGP grant								
13	funds have been awarded; and								
14	WHEREAS, at its meeting on June 12, 2018, the Board directed the Broward								
15	County Cultural Division ("Division") and the Greater Fort Lauderdale Convention &								
16	Visitors Bureau ("CVB") to develop a second annual application cycle to allow the Board,								
17	at its discretion, to award in any year any remaining available TDTCCGP funds; and								
18	WHEREAS, the proposed amendments serve a public purpose, and the Board								
19	desires to amend the Administrative Code to make the requested revisions, NOW,								
20	THEREFORE,								
21	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF								
22	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:								
23	Section 1. Section 29.14 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby								
24	amended to read as follows:

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Except as permitted by Section 29.16j.6., lif an applicant (5) receives TDT Capital Challenge grant funding pursuant to this section, it shall not apply for or be eligible to receive additional TDT Capital Challenge grant funding for the same project.

#### 3. Requested Award Size:

Requests may be made in any amount up to Five Hundred (a) Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), and any awarded grant is contingent upon available capital funds as determined annually by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners. Multiple year awards may be considered, but the total grant may not exceed \$500,000. The applicant must also demonstrate the ability to provide in-kind services and other available funding for the project equal to the amount requested as follows:

Review Criteria: In order to be deemed responsive, an application for a 4. TDT Capital Challenge Grant must be for a purpose expressly authorized by the Local Option Tourist Development Act (Section 125.0104, Florida Statutes). In March Before April 30 of every year, the Cultural Division will appoint a review panel of subject matter experts and hoteliers to complete a Due Diligence Review (as described below) of each application and determine eligibility and proposed funding, if any, for each applicant. Application reviews will be completed prior to the commencement of the

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County's Budget Workshops, usually in June of each year. The review panel will consist of five (5) members: one (1) member who has served on the Broward Cultural Council ("Council") for at least five (5) consecutive years; one (1) member who is the Tourist Development Council liaison to the Council; and three (3) members who are hoteliers identified by the Tourist Development Council. The Review Sheet that will be used by the review panel will be included with each application, including the review report by GFLCVB of the "bed nights" that were projected by the Diligence Review will ensure verification of applicant(s). Due documentation submitted, including, but not limited to: active nonprofit status, financial capacity, organizational capacity, and ability to meet projected "beds nights" as determined by GFLCVB. Each application will be reviewed by the panel and given a narrative rating of: (1) High; (2) Medium; (3) Low; or (4) Nonresponsive/Ineligible. The review panel will focus on the following criteria:

(h) Priority will be given to projects that:

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2. Exceed the 2:1 <u>cash</u> match requirement;

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- 5. How to Apply:
  - (a) Except as provided in Section 29.16j.6., Eentities seeking funding under the Tourist Development Tax Capital Challenge Grant Program TDTCCGP must submit a completed application between

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December 1st and by February 15th, to the Broward County Cultural Division, consistent with the provisions of Section 29.15 of the Broward County Administrative Code.

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### 6. Second Application Cycle:

<u>(a)</u> Before its summer recess, at the time the Board awards the incentive grants, if more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) remains in the Convention Center Capital Fund for the TDTCCGP. the Board has the discretion to initiate a second grant application cycle ("Second Application Cycle"). Grant applications for the Second Application Cycle are due no later than September 30, except in the initial year of the Second Application Cycle when grant applications are due October 30, 2018. The recommended awards by the Cultural Division's review grant panel shall be submitted to the Board no later than November 30, except that in the initial Second Application Cycle, they shall be submitted no later than December 15, 2018. The provisions in Section 29.16j. govern the Second Application Cycle, except that grant applicants shall only be required to commit and have available, through cash contributions, a minimum ratio of one dollar (\$1) matching funds to one dollar (\$1) grant funds (1:1); may apply for more than one (1) grant in a five (5) year period; and may apply for as much as One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) on a cumulative basis in a five (5) year period.

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(b) Nonprofit organizations and public entities shall provide business plans that outline the feasibility of the capital project for which funding is sought. The applicant is required to demonstrate, through a business plan, that it has available a minimum cash match which consists of one dollar (\$1) for every one dollar (\$1) requested in the grant application; and the applicant must identify the source(s) and composition of funds that constitute the minimum cash match of the project's total cost.

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Section 4. Section 29.17 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### 29.17. General Incentive Program Information.

a. General Restrictions:

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- In the application(s) submitted by an eligible applicant, funds requested, or obtained, from any of the operating award programs or the project award programs shall not be used by the applicant to fund or support an identical cultural program, event, service, or activity, with the exception of <u>TDTCCGP</u>.
- 3. Each fiscal year, an applicant organization (including nonprofit, public entity, or sovereign native American nation, *i.e.*, a federally recognized native American Indian tribe) or individual applicant may apply for any incentive program for which the organization or individual is eligible but may submit only one (1) application for each program. However, in the

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TDTCCGP,	applicants	may	submit	one	(1)	application	in	each	of	the	twc

4. A consortium or an alliance of organizations may apply for the Cultural Festival Program, or the Cultural Tourism Program, or the TDTCCGP; however, all members of the consortium or alliance shall meet all eligibility requirements. One (1) organization shall be the lead applicant. An applicant's participation either as the lead applicant or participating member applicant in a consortium application or alliance of organizations shall count as an application toward that program's application limit.

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8. Each fiscal year, subject to meeting the eligibility requirements, and regardless of the program application limits stated above in this section or in the individual program in Section 29.16, an eligible applicant may also submit one (1) program incentive application to the Cultural Planning and Facilities Program, and the Creative Place Making Program, or to the Tourist Development Tax Capital Challenge Grant Program. In the TDTCCGP, applicants may apply in both the First and Second Application Cycles.

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## Section 5. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any

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individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the 2 applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, 3 property, or circumstance. Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code. 4 Section 6. 5 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this 6 Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code 7 as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be 8 renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention. 10 11 Section 7.
