2 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY
3 COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA,
4 PERTAINING TO PORT EVERGLADES TARIFF NO. 12;
5 AMENDING CHAPTER 42, EXHIBIT 42.A, OF THE
6 BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE
7 ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"), AMENDING THE RATES FOR
8 VARIOUS ACTIVITIES AT PORT EVERGLADES; AND
9 PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE
10 ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County desires to
12 amend Chapter 42, Exhibit 42.A, of the Broward County Administrative Code to provide
13 for revisions to Port Everglades Tariff No. 12 items for dockage rates for cargo vessels,
14 cruise ships, lay-in vessels and yachts; berth usage for tendering/fleet landing; container
15 and cargo staging; wharf use charge; nonwaterborne liquid bulk transfer; intercoastal
16 container ocean carriers; wharfage rates for cargo and cruise passengers; container unit
17 charges; inside transit shed storage rates; open ground storage rates; wharf demurrage
18 rates; container gantry and mobile harbor cranes rental rates; waiver/reduction of
19 dockage charges; sanitary waste water removal from vessels; standby fire watch service
20 fees; harbormaster fees; linehandler fees; labor and equipment fees; potable water, hose
21 rental, and hook-up fees; overtime charges for use of facilities; and grid yard areas; and

22 WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that the revisions to Port
23 Everglades Tariff No. 12, as set forth herein, are necessary and in the best interests of
24 Broward County, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

1 Section 1. Chapter 42, Exhibit 42.A, of the Broward County Administrative

7 the prior approval of the Port Everglades Department, Operations Division. All requests
8 must be made in a timely manner but not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the
9 staging area being needed. Consideration of a request will include the need for the
10 requested staging area prior to and following the requested use. If the request is
11 approved, it will be for a time certain period. Use of the staging area without permission,
12 or prior to and/or after the time certain period, will result in a penalty of ~~\$66.00~~ sixty-eight
13 dollars (\$68) per calendar day or portion thereof for each container, chassis, piece of
14 cargo or equipment.

8 charges in accordance with Section Six for the number of days the cargo, containers, and
9 trailers were on-hand beginning from the date of receipt at Port Everglades. There is no
10 free time provided to ~~non-waterborne~~ nonwaterborne cargo.

12 will be considered to have earned wharfage for purposes of billing at the applicable
13 wharfage charge.

3 written report summarizing that month's activity to the Port Everglades Department,

5 will include the date of receipt, description of the commodity, and quantity in gallons
6 received.

7 All liquid bulk alternative fuels, renewable fuels, including ethanol, other alcohols, and
8 bio diesel brought into the Port Everglades jurisdictional area by truck and discharged
9 into tanks, whether fixed or portable, and on which no wharfage or other Port Everglades
10 charges have previously been paid, will be charged ~~\$.0074~~ \$.0076 per gallon, in lieu of
11 what otherwise would be charged for dockage, wharfage, fire service protection fee, and
12 marine services. Operators, terminals, or facilities receiving bulk alternative or
13 renewable fuels by truck during any given month will provide a written report
14 summarizing that month's activity to the Port Everglades Department, Petroleum Section
15 within five (5) business days after the end of the month. The report will include the date
16 of receipt, description of the commodity, and quantity in gallons received.

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1 To request a waiver of dockage charges, a written application for a waiver must be
2 submitted to the Port Everglades Chief Executive prior to a vessel's arrival at Port
3 Everglades. For military vessels participating in the annual scheduled Fleet Week
4 celebration and related events at Port Everglades, the Chief Executive may, subject to
5 berth availability, intended use, length of stay, absence of interference with other Port
6 Everglades users and activities, and other criteria as may from time to time be established
7 by the Port Everglades Department, approve a total or partial waiver of all dockage
