**Subject:** Status of Florida's FY17 JAG Funding

Byrne/JAG Subgrant Chief Officials and Project Directors:

FDLE has submitted a State of Florida application for FY17 JAG funding, which is currently pending approval by DOJ Office of Justice Programs (OJP). As you may be aware, the state must certify compliance with new conditions and attestations prior to accepting the award. FDLE has been coordinating with the Executive Branch to complete this process.

Until Florida receives the federal award and a decision is made whether the state will accept the terms and conditions, FDLE is not able to approve new JAG subawards. This will impact availability of funds for subrecipients that planned to begin grant-funded projects effective October 1, 2017.

We are aware some agencies use JAG funds to pay personnel costs for positions, or sustainment costs for legacy-funded or continuation projects (e.g., task forces, targeted enforcement, etc.). An email was recently distributed notifying of this delay, and providing a reminder that grant-funded projects should be developed with a sustainment plan in place in the event grant funds are not available.

Florida has received continuous federal JAG funding for many decades, and we are doing everything possible to ensure this funding continues.

We have posted allocations for the FY17 JAG-Countywide cycle in anticipation of receiving the federal award. This information has been made available for local units of government to begin strategic planning efforts in the event funds become available and FDLE can begin approving subawards.

Due to the delays this year, FDLE will not be issuing hard-copy notifications by mailing grant packages to County Commissioners or Mayors. All requirements for this year's JAG process, including allocations, eligibility requirements, the "51% process," solicitations, and application instructions will be communicated electronically via our website (<a href="www.fdle.state.fl.us/cms/Grants/Home.aspx">www.fdle.state.fl.us/cms/Grants/Home.aspx</a>). This site will be updated as information becomes available.
