## **RESOLUTION NO. 2018-**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO MOTOR CARRIER RATES AND FEES; AMENDING SECTION 40.50 OF BROWARD COUNTY THE ADMINISTRATIVE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); INCREASING THE ÄLLOWABLE FARE FOR PICK UPS AT FORT LAUDERDALE-**HOLLYWOOD AIRPORT AND** INTERNATIONAL EVERGLADES; CREATING AN INTRAFACILITY FEE; REMOVING FEES RELATED TO TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES AND CERTIFIED MOTOR CARRIERS: AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE. AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 40.50 of the Broward County Administrative Code ("Administrative Code") sets forth taximeter rates in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, under Section 22½-11(c) of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code"), at two-year intervals, the Environmental and Consumer Protection Division ("Division") is to provide a written recommendation on taxicab rates based upon the Consumer Price Index ("CPI") and other information as deemed appropriate by the Division; and

WHEREAS, based upon the CPI, feedback from the taxicab industry, and other information, the Division recommended an increase to the current drop rate, an increase to the minimum fare that may be charged to passengers picked up at Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport ("Airport") and Port Everglades ("Port"), and the creation of a Port/Airport intrafacility flat rate fee; and

WHEREAS, Section 40.50 of the Administrative Code also sets fees for transportation network companies ("TNCs") and certified motor carriers; and

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WHEREAS, on June 5, 2018, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") enacted an amendment to Chapter 22½ of the Code, removing provisions related to TNCs and certified motor carriers after Broward County's regulation of TNCs was preempted by state law; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend Section 40.50 of the Administrative Code to (i) increase the drop rate; (ii) increase the minimum fare that may be charged to passengers picked up at the Airport and Port; (iii) create an intrafacility fee for the Port and Airport; and (iv) reflect the amendments to the Code deleting regulations on TNCs and certified motor carriers, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 40.50(b) of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

## 40.50. Environmental and Consumer Protection Fee Schedule.

b. Taximeter Rates. These rates shall be:
