RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COUNTY THE COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY. FLORIDA. SENATE BILL 102, SUPPORTING WHICH CREATES MANDATORY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR RECOVERY RESIDENCES IN FLORIDA: DIRECTING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR **TRANSMIT COPIES** TO RESOLUTION THE TO BROWARD LEGISLATIVE **DELEGATION AND** STATE **LEGISLATORS** REPRESENTING BROWARD COUNTY RESIDENTS: AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in 2017, Broward County treated 1,642 cases of opioid overdoses and continues to see a dramatic number of opioid-related deaths;

WHEREAS, recovery residences (also known as "sober homes" or "sober living homes") are alcohol-and-drug-free living environments where individuals with substance use disorders reside while they receive treatment on an outpatient basis;

WHEREAS, in 2015, the Florida Legislature enacted statutes establishing voluntary certification programs for recovery residences and recovery residence administrators;

WHEREAS, applicable law prohibits substance abuse treatment providers from referring patients to recovery residences that are not certified or not owned and operated by a licensed substance abuse treatment provider;

WHEREAS, as of January 13, 2018, there were 312 certified recovery residences in Florida, though the exact number of recovery residences in Broward County is unknown;

WHEREAS, regulation of recovery residences is needed to create a consistent standard of operation that provides uniform and safe procedures, promotes accountability, and lessens abuse;

WHEREAS, Florida Senator Lauren Book has introduced Senate Bill 102, which seeks to create a mandatory certification program for recovery residences in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") supports the uniform regulation of recovery residences, NOW, THEREFORE,
