1 **RESOLUTION NO. 2019-**2 RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY. 3 OPPOSING EXTREME WELL STIMULATION IN OF STATE FLORIDA: URGING THE FLORIDA 4 LEGISLATURE TO **PROHIBIT** THE USE MEASURES; OPPOSING LEGISLATION PREEMPTING 5 THE COUNTY'S ABILITY TO REGULATE OIL AND DEVELOPMENT AND **EXTRACTION** 6 BORDERS; PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF THE RESOLUTION: AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY 7 AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 8 (Sponsored by Commissioner Beam Furr) 9 10 WHEREAS, Broward County has demonstrated a decades-long commitment to 11 protection of the environment with a strong focus on local and regional water resources; 12 WHEREAS, clean water is fundamental to the health of Florida's residents, 13 environment, and economy; 14 WHEREAS, public and private water utilities across Broward County rely entirely 15 upon groundwater sources, including the Biscayne and Floridan Aguifers, for potable 16 water supplies; 17 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 314 ("SB 314") and House Bill 239 ("HB 239") would 18 prohibit in the State of Florida all "advanced well stimulation treatment," including all 19 stages of a well intervention performed by injecting fluids into a rock formation, except for 20 routine well maintenance; 21 WHEREAS, SB 314 and HB 239 have been filed for consideration during the 2019 22 session of the Florida Legislature by Senator Bill Montford (D - Tallahassee) and 23 Representative Heather Fitzenhagen (R – Ft. Myers), respectively; 24

 WHEREAS, in November 2018, Florida voters approved Constitutional Amendment 9 with nearly seventy percent (70%) of the vote, prohibiting offshore oil and gas drilling in the State's coastal waters;

WHEREAS, extreme well stimulation such as hydraulic and acid fracturing (also known as "fracking") is the process of pumping a complex mix of fluids and chemicals, including large volumes of water, under very high pressure into or below the surface of the ground to create fractures in oil- or gas-bearing geologic formations for the purpose of producing or recovering oil or gas;

WHEREAS, fracking also includes, but is not limited to, the processes known as hydraulic fracturing, acid fracturing, cyclic steam injection, matrix acidizing, and fracture acidizing;

WHEREAS, Florida's water supply comes from highly permeable limestone formations which are vulnerable to contamination from fracking or similar well stimulation techniques designed to extract hydrocarbons;

WHEREAS, Broward County receives its water from groundwater sources, including the Biscayne and Floridan Aquifers;

WHEREAS, Florida's oil and gas regulations, Part I of Chapter 377, Florida Statutes, and Rules 62C-25 through 62C-30, Florida Administrative Code, make no reference to fracking;

WHEREAS, in January 2014, an oil drilling company in Collier County was discovered to be using high-pressure injections of acid and water to blast open bedrock to gain access to oil reserves below underground aquifers;

WHEREAS, in July 2014, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection revoked the drilling permits of that oil drilling company and fined the company \$25,000;

1 WHEREAS, fracking poses potential risks for contaminating the Floridian Aquifer, 2 the source of drinking water for nearly ten million Floridians, including the residents of 3 **Broward County**; WHEREAS, it is imperative to take measures to adequately protect our State and 4 County's water supply and environment through better regulation of oil drilling methods 5 6 and extraction techniques; and 7 WHEREAS, in January 2016, the Board amended Section 27-193 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances to ban extreme well stimulation within Broward County, NOW, THEREFORE, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA: 12 13 14 Section 1. Broward County opposes the use of hydraulic fracturing, acid 15 fracturing, and any form of extreme well stimulation and resource extraction in the State 16 of Florida. 17 18 Section 2. Broward County opposes any legislation that would preempt 19 Broward County's ability to regulate oil and gas development and extraction within its 20 borders. 21 22 Section 3. The Board of County Commissioners urges the Florida Legislature

to enact SB 314, HB 239, or similar legislation prohibiting well stimulation techniques

collectively known as "fracking" in the State of Florida.

Section 4. The Board of County Commissioners directs the County's Intergovernmental Affairs and Boards Section to advocate for the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 3 above and authorizes and directs the Intergovernmental Affairs and Boards Section to amend the 2019 State Legislative Package to include this item.

Section 5. A copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Governor of Florida, the Secretary of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives, the President of the Florida Senate, and to all members of the Broward County Legislative Delegation.
