

FIFTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN BROWARD COUNTY AND SAGOMA CONSTRUCTION SERVICES INC., PROVIDING FOR ADMINISTRATION OF A PORTION OF COUNTY'S MINOR HOME REPAIR AND WATER AND SEWER CONNECTIONS PROGRAMS

This Fifth Amendment ("Fifth Amendment") to the Agreement (as defined below), is made and entered into by and between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and Sagoma Construction Services Inc., a Florida corporation ("Sagoma") (collectively referred to as the "Parties").

RECITALS

- A. On December 1, 2015, the Parties entered in an agreement providing for administration by Sagoma of a portion of County's Minor Home Repair and Water and Sewer Connections Programs ("Agreement").
- B. On June 27, 2016, the Parties entered into a First Amendment to Agreement ("First Amendment"), increasing funding under the Agreement and extending the term of the Agreement.
- C. On June 29, 2017, the Parties entered into a Second Amendment to Agreement ("Second Amendment"), increasing funding under the Agreement and further extending the term of the Agreement.
- D. On December 18, 2017, the Parties entered into a Third Amendment to Agreement ("Third Amendment"), increasing funding under the Agreement.
- E. On January 11, 2019, the Parties entered into a Fourth Amendment to Agreement ("Fourth Amendment"), increasing funding under the Agreement and extending the term of the Agreement. The First Amendment, Second Amendment, Third Amendment, and Fourth Amendment are included in the term "Agreement."
- F. The Parties desire to enter into this Fifth Amendment to increase the amount of funding under the Agreement by Eight Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$830,000).

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to the following:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference. All capitalized terms not expressly defined within this Fifth Amendment shall retain the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Agreement.
- 2. This Fifth Amendment shall be effective as of the date it is fully executed by the Parties.
- 3. Amendments to the Agreement made herein are indicated by use of strikethrough text to show deletions and underlining to show additions.

- 4. Section 5.1 of the Agreement shall be amended as follows:
 - 5.1 The maximum amount of funds payable hereunder as either reimbursement or payment to SAGOMA as compensation shall be Three Million Seven Hundred Eight Thousand One Hundred Forty-three Dollars (\$3,708,143) Four Million Five Hundred Thirty-eight Thousand One Hundred Forty-three Dollars (\$4,538,143), subject to the availability of the Funds from the various funding sources. The dollar limitation set forth herein is a limitation upon, and describes the maximum extent of, COUNTY's obligation to SAGOMA, but does not constitute a limitation, of any sort, upon SAGOMA's obligation to incur such expenses in the performance of services hereunder.
- 5. Exhibit "C-3" to the Agreement is hereby deleted and replaced in its entirety with Exhibit "C-3" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Any reference to Exhibit "C," Exhibit "C-1," Exhibit "C-2," or Exhibit "C-3" in the Agreement shall be deemed a reference to Exhibit "C-3" attached hereto.
- 6. Exhibit "G" to the Agreement is hereby deleted and replaced in its entirety with Exhibit "G" attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 7. This Fifth Amendment may be executed in multiple originals, and may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same amendment.
- 8. Preparation of this Fifth Amendment has been a joint effort of the Parties and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the Parties than the other.
- 9. Except as modified in this Fifth Amendment, all terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. If any conflict or ambiguity exists between this Fifth Amendment and the Agreement, the Parties agree that this Fifth Amendment shall control.
- 10. This Fifth Amendment incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements, and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein, and the Parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements, or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Fifth Amendment that are not contained in the Agreement and this Fifth Amendment.
- 11. Sagoma represents and warrants that this Fifth Amendment constitutes the legal, valid, binding, and enforceable obligation of Sagoma, and that neither the execution nor performance of this Fifth Amendment constitutes a breach of any agreement that Sagoma has with any third party or violates any law, rule, regulation, or duty arising in law or equity applicable to Sagoma. Sagoma further represents and warrants that execution of this Fifth Amendment is within Sagoma's legal powers, and each individual executing this Fifth Amendment on behalf of Sagoma is duly authorized by all necessary and appropriate action to do so on behalf of Sagoma and does so with full legal authority.
