Motion to Direct Office of the County Attorney to draft a Resolution amending Section 21.8 of the Broward County Administrative Code (Procurement Code) to increase the

mandatory bid amount from \$50,000 to \$100,000

Attached is a summary chart of a survey that was conducted to determine dollar thresholds for various County agencies.

Increasing Broward County's Mandatory Bid Amount from \$50,000 to \$100,000 would improve the processing time for small dollar procurements. Currently, procurement values in excess of \$50,000 require a formal competitive procurement process which could take up to 90 - 120 days to process dependent upon the complexity of the procurement. Increasing the mandatory bid amount would eliminate the need for a formal process, and allow for more of an informal procurement process, which could potentially yield a reduction in procurement processing time by 60 - 75 days.

In the event that the Board approves the increase in the mandatory bid amount from \$50,000 to \$100,000, for the last calendar year, approximately 3,000 procurements fell within the recommended threshold increase and could have been handled through an informal procurement process.
