5	BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE") TO ESTABLISH APPRENTICE PARTICIPATION
6	REQUIREMENTS FOR COUNTY CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS; PROVIDING FOR CONTRACTORS TO
7	PARTICIPATE IN AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM FOR SPECIFIED COUNTY CONTRACTS; AND PROVIDING FOR
8	SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

13	WHEREAS, many construction employers are having a difficult time filling some or
14	all skilled trade positions;
15	WHEREAS, the shortage of a sufficient number of candidates for skilled trade
16	positions could result in delays, expenses, and challenges to the County's future
17	construction projects;
18	WHEREAS, participation in an apprenticeship program will create opportunities for
19	training and experience that will assist in ensuring that a trained workforce will be
20	available in the future for County construction projects;
21	WHEREAS, requiring the employment of apprentices on certain County
22	construction projects will promote business and economic development by increasing the
23	number of skilled workers in Broward County; and

Section 1. Section 26-8 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

## Sec. 26-8. Apprentices for County Construction Contracts.

(a) Title.

This section may be cited as the "Construction Apprenticeship Program" (the 15 "Apprenticeship Program").

> Legislative Findings and Intent. (b)

There is a shortage of skilled labor for construction projects. This shortage of labor could result in delays, expenses, and other challenges to the County's future construction projects. Apprenticeships create opportunities for training and experience that will assist in ensuring that a trained workforce will be available for future County construction projects. By requiring contactors to use apprentices for County construction contracts, it is the intent of the County to increase the number of apprentices used by contractors, creating opportunities that will enable these apprentices to develop into more skilled labor that will then be available for County construction projects.

Coding:

Section 2. Section 26-9 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

#### Sec. 26-9. Definitions.

Apprentice means any person who is enrolled in and participating in an apprenticeship program registered with the Florida Department of Education or the United States Department of Labor. If a registered apprenticeship program does not exist for the type of work on the construction project, then apprentice means any person who is participating in a company-sponsored training program for that type of work.

*Bidder* means any individual, firm, corporation, partnership, company, association, joint venture, or other entity that seeks the award of a construction contract.

CBE or County Business Enterprise means an entity certified as a CBE pursuant to the County's Business Opportunity Act of 2012, as amended.

Contractor means any individual, firm, corporation, partnership, company, association, joint venture, or other entity that has a construction contract with the County.

Construction contract means a contract between the County and a contractor for a construction project.

Construction project means a project, funded by County dollars in an amount of at least \$2,000,000, that involves the process of building, altering, repairing, improving, or demolishing any public structure or building, or other public improvements of any kind to any real property owned or under the control of the County, which work is being performed under a construction contract.

Good faith efforts means that the contractor, without an intent to defraud or seek an unfair advantage, took all necessary steps to secure and maximize, consistent with

the requirements of this Ordinance, the required percentage for apprentices on a construction project.

Subcontractor means an entity or individual providing services to the County through a contractor for all or any portion of the construction contract.

Labor hours means the total hours worked on the site of a construction project by workers who are employed by contractors or subcontractors on the construction project, excluding hours worked by forepersons, superintendents, owners, and workers not subject to the County's rate of wages requirement under Section 26-5, Broward County Code.

Section 3. Section 26-10 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

### Sec. 26-10. Apprenticeship Requirements and Exceptions.

- (a) When responding to a solicitation for a construction project, a bidder must certify that:
  - (1) The bidder or its subcontractors participate in an apprenticeship program that is registered with the Florida Department of Education or the United States Department of Labor; or
  - (2) The bidder commits that at the time the bidder executes a construction contract, it or its subcontractors will be participating in an apprenticeship program that is approved by the Florida Department of Education or the United States Department of Labor; or
  - (3) There are no registered apprenticeship programs for any type of work to be performed on the construction project, but the contractor or its

subcontractors will use a person participating in a company-sponsored

- (3) The twelve percent (12%) requirement of labor hours on the construction project that must be performed by apprentices may be reduced by the County Administrator or designee if:
  - a. The contractor has demonstrated to the County that there is an insufficient number of apprentices available to meet the required percentage; or
  - The County Administrator or designee determines that there exists a
    disproportionately high ratio of material costs to labor hours, which
    makes infeasible the required percentage of apprentice participation;
    or
  - c. The County Administrator or designee determines that the ratio of apprentice to worker required by Florida law does not make the required percentage feasible.
- Section 4. Section 26-11 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

## Sec. 26-11. Required Documentation, Noncompliance, and Reporting.

(a) Required documentation. The contractor must prepare and submit, on a quarterly basis for the duration of the construction contract, accurate and timely records identifying the name, address, trade classification, whether the worker is an apprentice, the labor hours of all workers used by the contractor and each subcontractor on the construction project, and the cumulative number of hours worked on the project to date by apprentices. The contractor must require that each of its subcontractors prepare and maintain, for submittal by the contractor to the County, accurate and timely records

identifying the name, address, trade classification, and labor hours for apprentices used by the subcontractors on the construction project.

- Noncompliance. Failure of a contractor to comply with the requirements of (b) this Ordinance may subject the contractor to all remedies available to the County at law, including but not limited to debarment or suspension of the contractor from consideration for the award of future contracts, and termination of the construction contract.
- (c) Reporting. County staff must annually prepare a report that includes the total dollar value of awards of construction projects, the number of apprentices hired for the construction projects, the number of apprentices working on construction projects, the number of hours worked by apprentices on the construction projects, and the total labor hours expended on the construction projects.

#### Section 5. Severability.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

#### Section 6. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.

1	Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u> .
2	This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law. This Ordinance shall
3	apply prospectively only and shall not apply to solicitations advertised by the County prior
4	to the effective date of this Ordinance.
