Parking Garage updates as of 05/20/2019

Hollywood Tower/P-25:

- New: On April 29, 2019, County staff was notified that the previously approved generator location was no longer viable. A new location requiring redesign was offered.
- At the May 7, 2019 Regular Meeting (Item No. 62), the Board of County Commissioners voted 8 to 1 in favor of removing the restrictive covenants at West Lake Park, thereby permitting the Premises to be used for the P25 System (subject to compliance with all applicable legal requirements); While reaffirming their intent for dual path involving the CIRC.
- On May 7, 2019 the County Administrator sent a letter requesting a joint public meeting between the City of Hollywood and Broward County Commissions regarding the conflict resolution proceedings (with the City of Hollywood for the location of a radio communication tower in West Lake Park) pursuant to the Section 164.1055, Florida Statutes by adoption of Resolution No. 2019-023 on January 8, 2019. Meeting confirmation is pending. On May 8, 2019, County Staff submitted construction drawings and a permit package to the City of Hollywood Building Department for review and approval of the public safety tower construction at West Lake Park.
- On May 9, 2019, County staff received an email from the CIRC representative indicating that they believe their work on evaluating the CIRC for the radio system has concluded, noting that County staff has not received approvals from the CIRC on designs for equipment installation and routing submitted for their consideration on April 1, 2019. As part of the potential lease agreement, the CIRC has indicated a desire to be compensated for their reviews, which they have indicated to date totals \$120,000 in fees for legal, engineering, and architectural services and owner professional staff time.

Accreditation of Child Care Centers and Early Learning Facilities:

• New: Phase 1 Gold Seal Survey has 102 responses to date; licensees with Gold Seal certification are now availing themselves of the 10% license fee reduction. Final design completed for Broward Gold Seal Initiative decal, to be made available to those with Gold Seal certification for on-site marketing. Additional marketing continues, especially including one-on-one interactions during facility inspections. Program has now been implemented and has entered the long-term management phase.

MSD Investigative Report:

(No update from last version)

The Police Foundation performed site visits during the week of April 15th. In addition, an MSD County Task Force meeting occurred on April 29, 2019 where updates where provided by the Police Foundation on progress that occurred during their site. A gap analysis report is anticipated in June 2019.

Lauderhill Transit Center-Construction Update:

(No update from last version)

• The County has submitted the engineering drawings to FDOT for their review and approval. County PW-CMD has received approval from City of Lauderhill-Building Official to start review of the 100% permit construction documents (currently 80% construction drawings are under internal review) simultaneously with the County's - competitive bidding process & period. Pending final approvals of permitting and bidding, construction should start December 2019 and end December 2020.

Bridge Scholarship Program-Implementation Information:

(No update from last version)

 On April 30th, a meeting was held between Executive Staff and Administration of both Broward College and Broward County to discuss the program being proposed by Broward College. Next step is for the proposal to be presented to the Board for consideration as part of the budget process.

Convention Center Hotel:

(No update from last version)

We remain in schematic design for the project. We are currently on target to submit a DRC package to the City of Fort Lauderdale in May 2019. The "final" development contract with Matthews is being negotiated and is expected to be presented to the Board Q3 FY 2019. Negotiations on the final agreement with Omni have also commenced.

Alpha 250 Property:

(No update from last version)

• Staff is assisting Commissioner Furr, the County Commission's designated representative on this matter, in working with the municipalities on developing a definitive scope of work for a second study. When finalized, a study proposal will be presented to the Board for its review and approval. Commissioner Furr appeared before the Broward League of Cities on Thursday, April 4, 2019, and presented a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that contemplates a second study and addresses other key principles related to the potential development of a collaborative, regional arrangement for solid waste and recycling

services. The MOU has been distributed to the relevant municipalities for review and comment. The MOU will subsequently be presented for the Board's consideration.

Spectrum Building Analysis and Spec Sheet:

• New Highlighted: Staff and Spectrum continue to work on resolving the outstanding title issue. While reviewing the title and survey, staff identified an 80-foot canal easement as an objection to the title. Due to the timeframes provided in the Purchase and Sale Agreement, the County sent a termination letter to Spectrum as the title issue remained unresolved. At the May 7th, 2019 Regular Meeting (Item No. 69), The Board approved a motion to rescind the termination and authorize the County Administrator to execute an amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement to provide for additional time to review the title objection. The Consultant has issued a "Feasibility Study on the Spectrum Office Park" site.

<u>Living Wage – HC Differential & Contract Amendments:</u>

• New Highlighted: As of May 16, 2019, all but one of the 113 county-wide direct service contracts have an executed written consent and express waiver or a written amendment agreeing to the higher living wage. The County and First Transit (paratransit transportation services) have reached an amendment which will be presented to the Board for approval prior to the summer break. All but one of the 54 ASPA providers have executed the consent and waiver. The Aviation Department continues its discussions with the concessionaires for the application of the higher living wage, which are complex as these contracts are revenue-generating for the County and do not involve a payment for services, but discussions have been productive. BCAD is in receipt of the information required for mitigation requests from two out of the five concessionaires. The other three remaining concessionaires are in the process of resubmitting their information. BCAD staff is confident that there is an agreement in concept with all the concessionaires and anticipates a final agreement to be reached in late May. Additional details are contained in the Staff Report on Amended Living Wage Implementation provided to the Board on April 1, 2019.

Judge Tuter Request for Courtroom:

• New Highlighted: On March 5, 2019, the Board approved funding in the amount of \$350,000 for the implementation of the design for the Complex Trial Courtroom at the West Building. In addition, the Board requested submitting a request to the Florida Legislature to fund a portion of construction costs. Staff has completed negotiation of the contract amendment required to integrate the fees and scope of work into the County's agreement with the Spillis Candela and Partners/Heery/Cartaya Joint Venture, which will be presented to the Board for approval prior to the summer break. The design work for the

Complex Trial Courtroom is scheduled to be completed in mid-Fall, 2019. Staff has prepared and submitted documents required to allocate the necessary balance of project funds in the FY20 budget process which will make construction funds available on October 1, 2019. Preparations for selecting a contractor for the construction of the courtroom will begin this summer anticipating the completion of design, availability of construction funds and that subsequent contractor selection taking place toward the end of the year.

C-51 Reservoir Project:

• New Highlighted: Legislation allowing for state appropriation of funds and participation of the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has been approved by the State Legislature and is awaiting signature by the Governor. The bill ensures operations prioritize permitted water supply benefits, maintains the operation and maintenance agreement with the SFWMD, and retains potential for state appropriations and participation in the project. Staff continues to coordinate with local water providers regarding potential Phase I participation.

Vacant Parcels in District 2:

• New: At the May 7, 2019 Regular Meeting (Item No. 66) the Board approved the conveyance of 23 parcels to the City of Pompano Beach and the Pompano Beach CRA for the development of affordable housing (22 parcels) and for park purposes (one parcel).

Memorial for MSD:

• New: The memorial committee, including representation from Coral Springs, Parkland, victim family members, the School Board, and the Cultural Council met on April 1 and May 6, 2019 to address the memorial. The next meeting is scheduled for June 3, 2019.

Full Implementation of the Paratransit Rider's Choice Program:

(No update from last version)

• Staff is evaluating the feasibility of using the Cabconnect payment card system to provide an alternative to paying cash. At its March 28, 2019 Public Hearing, the Board approved increasing the per trip subsidy from \$15.00 to \$18.00, which became effective April 2, 2019. Staff has begun a campaign to increase Program enrollment by contacting every paratransit customer who meets the eligibility guidelines. A recommendation will be made to the Board prior to the expiration of the 2-year extension of the pilot

Awards Program:

• New Highlighted: The Awards Program was introduced to staff on February 1st via an email from County Administration and notifications in BCNET and Sun-E-News. To date, we have received approximately 109 submissions. Of those submitted, approximately 28 are pending additional information, and 6 submissions are being reviewed by the Executive Committee for a potential award.

EV Infrastructure:

• New: Staff continues to coordinate implementation of a Phase I EV investment plan. Due to amperage requirements, external services are being solicited to detail capacity requirements and infrastructure costs for expansion of the Broward EV fleet over the next 5 years. An initial proposal with a local engineering consulting firm is under review. Concurrently, staff is in the process of securing installation of three (3) dual level 2 charges for 6 fleet vehicles at GCE and one (1) dual level 2 charges for 2 fleet vehicles at GCW. Staff continues to collect information on various EV charging companies that might support both public and private investments.

Reimbursement of County Money for Courthouse Furnishings:

(No update from last version.)

• The County Attorney's Office has briefed each Commissioner on this potential claim and will continue to work with staff to pursue state reimbursement.

Restrooms at Everglades Holiday Park:

(No update from last version.)

• One plumber remains on call every weekend and a second plumber is assigned to Everglades Holiday Park (EHP). Parks plumbers have stocked spare parts that are likely to be needed to make repairs. EHP now has additional toilet facilities available to the public, plus additional port-a-potties to accommodate park patrons during the peak season. Restroom availability signage has been installed throughout the park, including a restroom locator map on the outside wall of the main building at the top of the stairs.

Migration of School Buses Off Emergency Radio System:

• New: Broward Schools has programmed 524 of the 1400 radios to be used on the Local Government Radio system. The migration is on track for the August 1, 2019 cutover.

Tree Trimming Ordinance:

• <u>New</u>: The motion directing the County Administer to publish notice of public hearing for consideration of revisions to the Tree Trimming ordinance is on the agenda of the May 21, 2019, Regular Meeting (Item No. 51).

Innovation Hub

(No update from last version.)

 County Staff is meeting with NSU Leadership on May 20th to discuss and finalize terms of the amendment.

Emergency Shelters:

• New: County Staff met with the Broward League of Cities and the Broward School Board on Tuesday, May 7, 2019. There was no resolution. The representative from Broward League of Cities requested the County Administrator to discuss this item with the Broward County City Managers Association (BCCMA). On May 15, 2019, the County Administrator discussed this item at the BCCMA. Additional information has been requested and will be provided to the BCCMA.

Status of TPA not Contradicting Doctor's Orders:

• New: Staff is researching the request.
