RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF **BROWARD** COUNTY. FLORIDA. RELATING TO THE REEVALUATION OF LAKE OKEECHOBEE OPERATIONS BY THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS PURSUANT TO THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT ASSESSMENT FOR THE LAKE OKEECHOBEE SYSTEM OPERATING MANUAL; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Lake Okeechobee is the liquid heart of an integrated regional water management system and is essential to and interconnected with the region's communities, businesses, public water supply utilities, and ecosystems;

WHEREAS, Lake Okeechobee is an integral component of the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan (CERP) and is critical to meeting the environmental restoration and water supply needs of South Florida;

WHEREAS, Lake Okeechobee is essential to protecting the region's water supply infrastructure from saltwater intrusion by providing a source of freshwater to prevent the migration of saltwater into coastal wellfields;

WHEREAS, Lake Okeechobee's authorized project purposes include flood control, water supply, recreation, navigation, environmental effects to fish and wildlife, and cultural and recreational resources;

WHEREAS, Section 1106 of the 2018 Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) directs the Secretary of the Army to expedite completion of the Lake Okeechobee regulation schedule to coincide with completion of the Herbert Hoover Dike project, which may positively affect CERP's water supply and ecosystem restoration projects;

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WHEREAS, in January 2019, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) began preparation of a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) assessment for the Lake Okeechobee System Operations Manual (LOSOM) that, in accordance with Section 1106 of the 2018 WRDA, is to reevaluate and define operations for the Lake Okeechobee regulation schedule that takes into account nearly complete additional infrastructure that will soon be operational components of the water management system;

WHEREAS, rehabilitation activities by the Corps on Lake Okeechobee's Herbert Hoover Dike began in 2001 and are expected to be complete by 2022;

WHEREAS, the Lake Okeechobee Regulation Schedule of 2008 (LORS08) was implemented as an interim measure to protect the public from the risk of catastrophic failure of the Herbert Hoover Dike; and

WHEREAS, Broward County wishes to provide direction as to which measures Broward County supports and which measures it opposes in the Lake Okeechobee operations reevaluation process and the resultant LOSOM, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- Section 1. The Broward County Board of County Commissioners ("Board") hereby supports the following measures as they relate to the reevaluation of Lake Okeechobee operations by the Corps:
 - A science-based evaluation that is transparent and acknowledges and balances all congressionally authorized purposes of Lake Okeechobee operations;

1 b) Performance measures that appropriately and accurately characterize 2 impacts to all communities as they relate to water supply, the environment, 3 and the economy; 4 The incorporation of data and methods to ensure proposed operations c) 5 improve lake ecology, protect water supplies, and are robust and resilient 6 to expected climatic variability; 7 d) The implementation of water storage and water quality treatment projects 8 in Lake Okeechobee tributary basins north of the Lake; 9 e) Lake Okeechobee operations that reduce flood risk and flood insurance 10 premiums for residents and businesses located southeast of the Lake; f) 11 Lake Okeechobee operations that assist in achieving restoration flows and 12 other key ecosystem goals, including performance measures developed by 13 CERP's Restoration Coordination & Verification (RECOVER) program; 14 g) The avoidance and/or minimization of Lake Okeechobee discharges to the 15 Lake Worth Lagoon and the Loxahatchee River; and 16 h) Reductions in water use restrictions and cutbacks on public water utilities 17 and existing permitted users, as compared to those that occur under 18 LORS08. 19 20 Section 2. The Board hereby opposes the following measures as they relate to 21 the reevaluation of Lake Okeechobee operations by the Corps: 22 a) Drastically lowering Lake Okeechobee to levels not supported by sound

science (e.g., 10.5 feet or lower), which would induce drought conditions,

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impact the ability to deliver water to critical ecosystems, and result in significant environmental damage;

- b) Lake Okeechobee operations that result in increased risk of saltwater intrusion into coastal wellfields, which would cause irreversible damage to freshwater supplies, affect the health and safety of residents, and result in the need for massive alternative water supply infrastructure investments; and
- c) Lake Okeechobee operations that result in restrictions on recreational and commercial fishing, which would impact small businesses such as marinas, fishing guide services, and the hospitality industry.

Section 3. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.
