DISTRICT FOUR HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered into thisday of, 20, by and between the STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, a component agency of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the DEPARTMENT and BROWARD COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the AGENCY collectively referred to as Parties.
WITNESSETH: WHEREAS, the AGENCY has jurisdiction over Old Griffin Road from Griffin Road to Bryan Road, as part of the County roadway system; and
WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 339.07, 339.08 and 339.12, Florida Statutes and Federal funding provisions the DEPARTMENT is authorized to undertake projects within the AGENCY's geographical limits and the AGENCY agrees to have this improvement constructed; and
WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority, the DEPARTMENT and the AGENCY agree to have the DEPARTMENT construct certain improvements more particularly described as Financial Project ID 436544-1-52-01, which involves adding bicycle lanes on the eastbound and westbound sides of Old Griffin Road by widening, resurfacing and restriping the existing roadway, construction of a concrete sidewalk on the south side of Old Griffin Road, installation of ADA compliant pedestrian ramps, adding drainage structures and modifying swale area impacted by the construction; hereinafter referred to as the "Project", as more particularly described in Exhibit A; and
WHEREAS, in accordance with Title 23, U.S. Code, Section 116 and Federal Highway Administration regulations issued pursuant thereto, there must be an agreement with the AGENCY to maintain the Project; and
WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT may not spend state funds for off-system projects; and
WHEREAS, the Parties hereto mutually recognize the need for entering into an Agreement designating and setting forth the responsibilities of each party; and
WHEREAS, the AGENCY by Action on theday of, 20, a copy of which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, desires to enter into this Agreement and authorizes its officers to do so;
NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual benefits to flow each to the other, the

1. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are deemed incorporated herein.

Parties covenant and agree as follows:

- 2. The DEPARTMENT has undertaken and obtained the approval of Federal participation for the Project. The AGENCY is responsible for additional Project costs determined to be Federal Aid Non-Participating.
- 3. The AGENCY shall allow the DEPARTMENT and its contractors to enter onto the existing AGENCY property to construct this Project. No further permit or agreement from the AGENCY shall be required to construct this Project. The AGENCY shall satisfy any tree permit obligation imposed by Broward County.
- 4. The AGENCY shall continue to maintain the existing roadway and any property owned by AGENCY until the DEPARTMENT begins construction of the Project. The AGENCY shall continue to be responsible for mowing and litter removal during the duration of the Project.
- 5. Upon "final acceptance" by the DEPARTMENT of the Project, (as "final acceptance" is described in the Standard Specifications for Roadway and Bridge Construction dated 2020, as amended), and Notice thereof to the AGENCY, the AGENCY shall maintain the Project, at its own cost, in accordance with the following Federally and State accepted standards: (a) FDOT Design Manual (FDM), current edition (b) Florida Green Book dated 2016, as amended (c) Governing Standards and Specifications: FDOT Design Standards dated FY 2019-20, as amended (d) Standard Specifications for Roadway and Bridge Construction dated 2020, as amended by contract documents, and (e) Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), current edition, or as amended. Maintenance of said Project includes, but is not limited to maintaining the bicycle lanes, sidewalk, ADA compliant curb ramps, pavement markings, drainage structures and swales. The Department shall give the AGENCY ten (10) days' notice before "final acceptance".
 - a. The AGENCY grants herein to the DEPARTMENT all rights necessary to enter and construct the Project.
- 6. No additional right of way is required for the Project. The Project can be completed within the AGENCY's public right of way.
- 7. Warranties: The DEPARTMENT shall transfer any applicable warranties to the AGENCY, upon the DEPARTMENT'S final acceptance of the Project.
- 8. Environmental permitting: If requested by the DEPARTMENT, the AGENCY shall sign as a joint applicant and be responsible for the permits related to the Project. Further the AGENCY shall be in compliance with all permits after the construction is complete and the right of way is transferred to the AGENCY. To the extent permitted by law, the AGENCY shall indemnify the DEPARTMENT for any violations by the AGENCY of any permits issued to the DEPARTMENT or jointly to the AGENCY and the DEPARTMENT after construction is complete. The AGENCY shall execute all documentation required by the permitting agencies in a timely manner to accept transfer of the Project. For various occupancy permits the AGENCY shall be the applicant.

- 9. Utilities: The AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT, to the extent necessary, to accomplish utility relocations for this Project. This shall include, but not be limited to, entering into utility subordination agreements with the affected utility owners, thereby assuming liability for future utility relocations within the AGENCY right of way and proposed right of way. This shall also include having the AGENCY require the Utility to relocate or adjust if the utility is there by permit, as necessary.
 - a. AGENCY'S Utilities: The AGENCY shall relocate and adjust its own utilities including connections with utility customers.
- 10. Signals: The AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT, to the extent necessary, to affect signal and interconnect connections for the Project.
- 11. Unforeseen issues: If unforeseen issues shall arise, the AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT, to the extent necessary, to construct the Project including but not limited to executing documents and allowing the DEPARTMENT or its contractor to enter into any real property owned, possessed and/or controlled by the AGENCY or any other occupancy right the AGENCY may have.
- 12. E-verify requirements: The AGENCY:
 - shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the AGENCY during the term of the contract; and
 - shall expressly require any contractors performing work or providing services pursuant
 to the state contract to likewise utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's EVerify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the
 contractor during the contract term.
- 13. This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements or understandings as represented in the Final Proposed Construction plans. Accordingly, it is agreed that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representation or agreements whether oral or written.
- 14. Additional Insured: The DEPARTMENT shall include the following paragraph as part of Section 7-13.2 of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Division 1, General Requirements and Covenants (January 2019), as amended, applicable to this Project:
 - "Cause Broward County to be an additional insured party on the Contractor's Public Liability and Property Damages Liability Insurance policies that insure the Contractor for the described work that it performs under the Contract."
- 15. This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted and construed according to the laws of the State of Florida.

EXHIBIT A

PROJECT SCOPE

All the improvements are to be completed by DEPARTMENT within the AGENCY's existing right-of-way.

Typical Section: New typical sections shall include pavement widening to add new continuous 4-foot designated bicycle lanes, with 2-foot buffer where applicable, on the eastbound and westbound sides of roadway and a six feet wide concrete sidewalk on the south side of the roadway. The lane width will be 12 feet.

Curb Ramps: New ADA compliant pedestrian ramps shall be installed, when impacted by the widening of pavement for bicycle lanes.

Signing and Pavement Markings: Existing signing and pavement markings shall be upgraded.

Drainage: Existing drainage swale will be regraded and new drainage structures will be installed when impacted by the pavement widening for the bicycle lanes.

Landscape: Trees that are impacted by the pavement widening for the bicycle lanes will be evaluated for survivability and relocated within the Project limit, if required.
