OF RESOLUTION THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO THE BROWARD COUNTY CLIMATE CHANGE TASK FORCE: REPEALING RESOLUTIONS 2008-442 AND 2008-616 WHICH CREATED **CLIMATE** CHANGE TASK FORCE AND AMENDED MEMBERSHIP, RESIDENCY  $\mathsf{AND}$ VACANCY PROVISIONS; CREATING PART III, SECTIONS THROUGH 12.25. OF CHAPTER 12 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); THE CLIMATE CHANGE TASK CODIFYING FORCE **ADDRESSING** AND ATTENDANCE. NOMINATION. AND **MEMBERSHIP** REQUIREMENTS AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Broward County Climate Change Task Force ("CCTF") was created by Resolution No. 2008-442 in order to develop and advise the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") on the implementation of a countywide Climate Change Program: and

WHEREAS. Resolution No. 2008-616 amended the CCTF membership, 1) increase the number of residency requirements, and vacancy provisions to: uncategorized members to five (5) and the total number of members to twenty-five (25); 2) exempt the CCTF membership from the residency requirements of Section 1-233 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code"), in recognition that the individuals with the greatest knowledge and expertise in climate change and having a willingness to serve on the CCTF may not all reside within Broward County, Florida; and 3) provide for all vacancies to be filled as at-large members by the Board; and

Coding:

WHEREAS, the 2016 Sunset Review recommendations for the CCTF included amendments to clarify the nomination and membership provisions and the applicability of the attendance requirements of Section 1-233 of the Code; and

WHEREAS, as an ongoing advisory board, the CCTF, as amended herein, is being codified at Chapter 12, Part III, Broward County Administrative Code, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Resolution Nos. 2008-442 and 2008-616 are hereby repealed in their entirety, and Part III, Sections 12.22 through 12.25 of Chapter 12 of the Broward County Administrative Code are hereby created to read as follows:

#### PART III. CLIMATE CHANGE TASK FORCE

### 12.22. Creation.

The Climate Change Task Force is hereby created to serve as an advisory board to the Broward County Board of County Commissioners.

## 12.23. Purpose and Goals

The purpose of the Climate Change Task Force shall be to develop a countywide Climate Change Program ("Program") for mitigation of the causes and adaptation to the consequences of climate change, and to advise the Board of County Commissioners on the Program's implementation. The goals of the Program shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) Development and implementation of projects that conserve energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions within government operations;
- (b) Development of incentives for residents, businesses, and organizations to conserve energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions;
- (c) Development and implementation of adaptation strategies to alleviate the likely adverse consequences of climate change, including rising sea levels, hurricanes, and other violent weather events;
- (d) Provision of education and outreach to encourage Broward County residents, businesses, and organizations to participate in the Program;
- (e) Pursuit of federal and state grants, energy cost savings, and other financial resources to offset Program costs; and
- (f) Coordination between the Board of County Commissioners, the School Board of Broward County, municipalities, other governmental agencies, businesses, private and public organizations, and the state of Florida in the adoption of programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in a cost-effective and efficient manner that preserves Broward County's competitiveness in the national and worldwide economy.

## 12.24. Membership.

The twenty-five (25) members of the Climate Change Task Force shall be appointed at large by the Board of County Commissioners with the following categorical representation:

- (a) Three (3) members representing Broward County government who shall be identified by position, one (1) of whom shall be chosen by the Board of County Commissioners to serve as Chair;
  - (b) One (1) member representing the Broward County Water Advisory Board;

If any Court determines that those Resolution, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies), or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

## Section 3. INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Resolution shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Administrative Code; and that the sections of this Resolution be renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.
