RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COUNTY THE COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATION AND DISBURSEMENT OF UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ("HUD") GRANT FUNDS IN THE **AMOUNT** OF \$7,647,750 AND Α **HUD-REQUIRED** BROWARD COUNTY MATCH OF \$878,136 FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$8,525,886 FOR FISCAL YEARS 2018 AND 2019 TO PROVIDE HOUSING AND SERVICES FOR HOMELESS FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS: APPROVING **FUNDING** SPECIFIED ORGANIZATIONS: TO THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR AUTHORIZING EXECUTE AGREEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS, AND TO TAKE ALL **NECESSARY ADMINISTRATIVE** BUDGETARY ACTIONS TO **IMPLEMENT**  $\mathsf{THE}$ AGREEMENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") has awarded Broward County funding for nineteen (19) local projects benefitting the homeless in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida ("Board"), finds programs benefiting the homeless to serve a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, homeless services will be provided by nonprofit organizations and governmental entities pursuant to the Community Partnerships Division's standard form agreement and the HUD addendum; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to authorize the County Administrator to execute the HUD grant agreement, the standard form agreement and HUD addenda, and any amendments to existing agreements for each project and organization listed on Attachment A, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. <u>Authorized Appropriations and Disbursements</u>. The Board hereby authorizes appropriations and disbursements of HUD grant funds and the HUD-required Broward County Match for Fiscal Years 2018 and 2019 as set forth in Attachment A hereto.

Section 2. <u>Execution by the County Administrator</u>. The County Administrator is authorized to execute the appropriate grant agreements with HUD. The County Administrator is authorized to execute the standard form agreement and HUD addenda previously approved by the Board, amendments to existing agreements, and to take any and all necessary administrative and budgetary actions in connection with the projects and organizations listed on Attachment A. Any deviations in any material respect from the approved standard form agreement and addenda shall be presented to the Board for approval.

## Section 3. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any Court determines that this Resolution, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies),

## KEY

- CoC P = CoC Planning Grant. Funding may be used "for costs of (1) Designing and carrying out a collaborative process for the development of an application to HUD; (2) Evaluating the outcomes of projects for which funds are awarded in the geographic area under the Continuum of Care and Emergency Solutions Grants programs; and (3) Participating in the consolidated plan(s) for the geographic area(s)."
- HMIS = Homeless Management Information System, the information system designated by the CoC to comply with data system requirements prescribed by HUD.

  Grant funds may be used to pay the costs of contributing data to the HMIS designated by the Continuum of Care per § 578.57 (a)(1). Awarded projects are required to enter all project data into HMIS.
- P = Permanent Beds, defined as community-based housing without a designated length of stay, and "the program participant must be the tenant on a lease for a term of at least one year that is renewable and is terminable only for cause" (HUD definition).
- P-RRH = Rapid Rehousing, "may provide supportive services ... and/or short term (up to 3 months) and/or medium-term (for 3 to 24 months) tenant based rental assistance ... as necessary to help homeless individuals or families, with or without disabilities, move as quickly as possible into permanent housing and achieve stability in that housing." (HUD definition)
- T = Transitional Beds, "the purpose of which is to facilitate the movement of individuals and families experiencing homelessness to permanent housing within 24 months or such longer period as the Secretary determines necessary" (HUD definition).

<sup>3</sup>Match: Amount of either cash or in-kind funds provided by grantees for the HUD projects. The County is required to provide match for the projects administered by its Divisions. These projects are: FL-601 Dedicated HMIS Project, FL-601 Planning Project, BP IV, HART & Home and NewHart. Individual amounts are identified by subscripts.
