2 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
3 OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO
4 MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS OF THE SMALL BUSINESS
5 DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY BOARD; AMENDING
6 SECTION 12.225 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE
7 CODE ("ADMINISTRATIVE CODE"); AND PROVIDING FOR
8 SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE,
9 AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners has determined
12 that amending Section 12.225 of the Broward County Administrative Code, pertaining to
13 the Small Business Development Advisory Board, is appropriate at this time, NOW,
14 THEREFORE,

15 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
16 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

17 Section 1. Section 12.225 of the Broward County Administrative Code is hereby
18 amended to read as follows:

19 **12.225. Appointment and Composition.**

20 a. The Advisory Board shall be composed of eleven (11) voting members, ~~all of~~
21 ~~whom~~ appointed by the Board of County Commissioners. Each Advisory Board member
22 shall be a residents of Broward County and serve a four-year term. ~~Each Broward County~~
23 ~~Commissioner shall nominate one (1) member to the Advisory Board.~~ Two (2) of the
24 eleven (11) members, ~~who~~ shall be at large positions and may be nominated by any
County Commissioner, ~~shall be at large positions, serving four-year terms, without regard~~

1 to the categorical requirements below, to allow for greater citizen participation. For the
2 remaining nine (9) members, the Board shall appoint members each County
3 Commissioner shall nominate one (1) member with consideration given to candidates
4 who represent the following categories organizations:

- 5 1. Minority-owned or -controlled small businesses owner;
- 6 2. Woman-owned or -controlled small businesses owner;
- 7 3. Small businesses owner;
- 8 4. Prime contractors;
- 9 5. Architectural or engineering consulting firms;
- 10 6. Financial institutions;
- 11 7. Small business technical assistance organizations;
- 12 8. Organizations comprised of or created to advocate for Mminority business
13 organizations; and
- 14 9. Organizations comprised of or created to advocate for Wwomen's small
15 business organizations.

17 Section 2. Severability.

18 If any portion of this Administrative Code Resolution is determined by any court to
19 be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity
20 of the remainder of this Administrative Code Resolution. If any court determines that this
21 Administrative Code Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any
22 individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the
23 applicability of this Administrative Code Resolution to any other individual, group, entity,
24 property, or circumstance.

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1 Section 3. Inclusion in the Broward County Administrative Code.

2 It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this
3 Administrative Code Resolution become part of the Broward County Administrative Code
4 as of the effective date. The sections of this Administrative Code Resolution may be
5 renumbered or relettered and the word "resolution" may be changed to "section," "article,"
6 or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish
7 such intention.

8 Section 4. Effective Date.

9 This Administrative Code Resolution is effective upon adoption.
