9	WHEREAS, Section 1-51.3 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code")				
10	provides certain authority to the County Administrator and County Attorney to settle				
11	claims; and				
12	WHEREAS, the Board finds that the Code should also include authority to the				
13	County Administrator, after consultation with the County Attorney, to reject certain				
14	settlement proposals when the County Administrator determines they would not serve the				
15	County's best interests,

17	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF				
18	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

20	Section 1. Section 1-51.3 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby				
21	amended to read as follows:

- (4) The County Administrator, after consultation with the County Attorney and upon determining that acceptance of a settlement proposal would not serve the County's best interests, (i) is authorized to reject the settlement proposal if it is for Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) or less; and (ii) is authorized to reject the settlement proposal in excess of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) where the terms of the settlement proposal would preclude timely consideration by the Board.
- (4) (5) The County Administrator is authorized to execute on behalf of the County all necessary and pertinent documents and pay vouchers for all settlements authorized under this Section 1-51.3.
- (5) (6) The Risk Management Director may exercise the authorities granted to the County Administrator under this section for Liability Claims for which the Claim Amount does not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000), for County Claims in any amount.

Section 2. <u>Severability</u>.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.
